## **EXAMINER HEARING**

This matter came on for hearing before the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division, MICHAEL E. STOGNER, Hearing Examiner, on Thursday, January 11th, 1996, at the New Mexico Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources

Department, Porter Hall, 2040 South Pacheco, Santa Fe, New Mexico, Steven T. Brenner, Certified Court Reporter No. 7 for the State of New Mexico.

WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 2 1:33 p.m.: EXAMINER STOGNER: This hearing will come to 3 order. 4 5 At this time I'm going to call Cases Number 6 11,459 and 11,450, which are both in the matter of the 7 hearing called by the Oil Conservation Division on its own motion to permit, on one of them, Abbott Ventures, 8 operator, Ralph Abbott, owner, and Allied Fidelity 9 Insurance Company, surety, and all other interested parties 10 to appear and show cause why a certain well in San Juan 11 County, New Mexico, should not be properly plugged and 12 abandoned; and in the other matter, to permit Ralph Abbott, 13 owner, owner/operator, Aetna Casualty and Surety Company, 14 surety, and other interested parties to appear and show 15 cause why another well in San Juan County, New Mexico, 16 should not be properly plugged and abandoned. 17 At this time I'll call for appearances. 18 MR. CARROLL: Rand Carroll on behalf of the Oil 19 Conservation Division. 20 21 I have one witness to be sworn in. 22 EXAMINER STOGNER: Are there any other 23 appearances? 24 There being none, Mr. Carroll, you have one 25 witness; is that correct?

1	MR. CARROLL: Yes.
2	EXAMINER STOGNER: And how is he going to appear
3	in this matter? In what proceedings?
4	MR. CARROLL: He's going to appear in both
5	proceedings, and I move that the cases be consolidated.
6	EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. Well, the Cases 11,449
7	and 11,450 will be consolidated.
8	I was asking, how is your witness going to appear
9	in this matter, for the record?
10	MR. CARROLL: Oh, he's going to appear by
11	telephone conference call from Aztec, New Mexico.
12	EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, and is he on the line at
13	this time?
14	MR. CARROLL: Yes, he is.
15	EXAMINER STOGNER: At this time I'm going to ask
16	the court reporter to swear your witness in.
17	(Thereupon, the witness was sworn.)
18	EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, with that, Mr. Carroll?
19	JOHNNY ROBINSON,
20	the witness herein, after having been first duly sworn upon
21	his oath, was examined and testified as follows:
22	DIRECT EXAMINATION
23	BY MR. CARROLL
24	Q. Mr. Robinson, will you please state your name,
25	your residence, and your employer the record?

- A. Johnny Robinson. I live in Aztec, New Mexico. I
  work for the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division. I'm a
  Field Rep II. I've been working with the Oil Commission
  for 11 years.
  - Q. And what are your responsibilities with the Oil Division?
  - A. My responsibilities are -- in this particular case is putting together the paperwork and writing letters to the operators advising them of what we do, and then we'll go on further to setting up plugging of the wells and other things.
  - Q. And do you put forth or set forth on paper the OCD-recommended plugging procedure for wells to be plugged in your district?
    - A. Yes, sir, I do.
  - Q. And you also oversee or monitor the actual plugging of these wells?
- 18 A. Right.

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- Q. Mr. Robinson, are you familiar with the two wells in question in Cases 11,449 and 11,450?
  - A. Yes, I am.
- Q. Let's start with Case Number 11,449, which is the
  Palmer well. Could you give us a brief history of the
  Palmer well and why it needs to plugged at this time?
- A. The Palmer well -- let's see, the -- What I have

is -- on pages 1 through 6, is the documentation showing
that the wells are out of compliance. And we started this
in 1993.

He did respond on page 7 with an intention to
test the well, and -Q. Pardon me, Mr. Robinson, I have the cases mixed

- Q. Pardon me, Mr. Robinson, I have the cases mixed up. The Palmer well is actually 11,450.
  - A. Right. Do you want to go ahead and do it, or --
  - Q. Whichever one you're on. Is it the Palmer well?
- A. Yes, sir. I noticed that number was different,

  but I didn't know which one was right. So I am on the

  Palmer.
- Q. Okay. If you could go forward with the history of the Palmer well, please.
  - A. Okay, I left off with an intention to test the well on page 7, and the well was never tested.
  - Pages 9 through 14 are various sundry notices for drilling permits and the completion of the well.
- And then I have a plugging schematic and procedure on page 17 and 18.
- 21 There was a --
- Q. And that's a procedure you recommend to be used for plugging this well?
- 24 A. Right.

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25 Q. Go on, Mr. Robinson.

- A. And then there was another intention to produce the well, which was never followed up on.
  - O. When was that?

- A. That was April the 15th of 1984, on page 26.
- Q. Okay, and that was never followed through?
- A. Right. On the Palmer well, there hasn't been any production at all.
  - Q. Since -- Never?
  - A. Since never.
    - Q. And what's the current condition of this well?
- A. The last time we inspected this well -- We inspected this well about two weeks ago, and the production equipment has been removed. I talked to Mr. Abbott, and he said someone had stolen the production equipment. So all we have now is just the well.

The well is located in a wooded area that's very close to a mall. The river, the San Juan River, is approximately 200 yards away from this well. And I feel like if we don't have the well plugged that it could cause problems in the environment and the river.

- Q. So you believe the plugging of this well is necessary at this time to protect fresh water, the public health and the environment?
  - A. Due to the location of the well, I do.
  - Q. All right, Mr. Robinson, is there a bond, a

8 plugging bond, for this well? 1 2 Α. Yes, sir, on Exhibit 3 there's a copy of the bond. 3 0. I think it's actually Exhibit 2. 5 Α. Excuse me, 2, Exhibit 2. And this is a copy of the bond file maintained by 6 Q. 7 Diane Richardson in Santa Fe? 8 Α. Right. So there's a \$5000 plugging bond issued by Aetna 9 Q. Casualty and Surety Company for this well? 10 Yes, sir. 11 Α. Do you recommend that if Ralph Abbott does not 12 plug this well that we foreclose on the bond and put the 13 \$5000 in the Oil and Gas Reclamation Fund? 14 15 Yes, I do. Α. 16 MR. CARROLL: And while we're on Case 11,450, Mr. Examiner, I would refer you to Exhibit Number 3, which is 17 the return receipts of letters sent to Ralph Abbott and the 18 19 insurance company, with the return receipts, showing that 20 they've received these letters giving notice of the 21 hearing. EXAMINER STOGNER: So noted. 22

MR. CARROLL: And with that, I move that Exhibits marked OCD Exhibits 1, 2 and 3 in Case 11,450 be admitted into the record.

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EXAMINER STOGNER: At this time, Exhibits 1, 2 and 3 in Case Number 11,450 will be admitted into evidence at this time.

- Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson, could you please refer to Exhibit Number 1 in Case Number 11,449?
  - A. Okay.

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- Q. And could you give us a brief history of the N.E. Hogback State NM Number 1 well?
  - A. Okay, the paperwork I have is basically the same as the Palmer well.

Page 1 through 5 is just a history of the documentation to the operator, and page 6 and 7 is a plugging wellbore schematic and a recommended plugging procedure for the particular well.

And then 7 through -- well, all the way -- all the way through is just copies of sundry notices concerning the well and the completion.

- Q. When was this well drilled, and when was the last date of production?
- 20 A. The well was a re-entry in 1985, and they re-21 entered the well and tested the well at that time, and then 22 it was never produced after that.
  - Q. Was it produced prior to 1985?
- A. I don't show anything. I don't have anything that far back.

- Q. Okay. Is there a bond covering this well?
- A. No, sir, the -- It did have a bond, but the bonding company is out of business and --
  - O. And that was Allied?
  - A. Yes, sir.
    - Q. So the bond that's on this well is worthless?
- 7 A. Right.

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- Q. What is the current condition of this well, that plugging is needed at this time?
- A. Currently, the -- This well is in an area that the fresh water is not as shallow as the other well, but that it could be -- If the well hasn't been plugged, it could lead to contamination of groundwater.
- Q. So you recommend that we plug this well at this time in order to protect fresh water, the public health and the environment?
- A. Yes, I do.
  - MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, also in Case 11,449,
    I would refer you to Exhibit Number 2, which is a copy of
    the certified letter with the return receipt signed showing
    that Abbott Ventures, Inc., care of Ralph Abbott, received
    notice of the hearing in this case.
- 23 EXAMINER STOGNER: So noted.
- MR. CARROLL: And I move that Exhibit Numbers OCD
  Exhibits 1 and 2 in Case 11,449 be admitted into evidence.

EXAMINER STOGNER: At this time, Exhibits 1, 2 and 3 will be admitted into evidence in Case Number 11,449.

Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson, are the well

- files that have been marked as OCD Exhibits Number 1 in each case kept by the OCD in its ordinary course of business?
  - A. Yes, it is.

- Q. Mr. Robinson, has the OCD had any contact with Mr. Ralph Abbott regarding these two wells?
- A. Yes, he -- I have talked to him a number of times trying to get some kind of compliance with the two wells, and I never have been able to do anything.
- Q. It's my understanding that you had a conversation with your district supervisor, Frank Chavez, and are you familiar with the content of those conversations at all?
- A. Yes, sir, I talked to him the other day about that.
- Q. It is my understanding Mr. Abbott had no problem with plugging the Northeast Hogback well, but he just needed some time to do it; is that correct?
- A. That's -- We didn't talk about that, Rand. The only thing I talked to him about was the -- You asked me if Frank had approved an extension.
  - Q. Extension of this hearing date?
- 25 A. Yes, sir.

1 Q. And -- ? And he said that he hadn't. 2 Α. MR. CARROLL: Okay. Mr. Examiner, I will offer 3 4 the following information: 5 Ralph Abbott contacted both Frank Chavez, the Aztec District Office Supervisor, and myself, and Mr. 6 7 Chavez and I have agreed to a 90-day period in order for Mr. Abbott to either plug or bring these wells back into 8 production. EXAMINER STOGNER: Mr. Carroll, is that in both 10 11 instances, or just the well in 11,449? MR. CARROLL: That's in both instances. 12 13 The well in 11,449, the Northeast Hogback, Mr. Abbott represented that he had no problem with plugging 14 that; he just needed some time to do it. 15 16 And the Palmer well in Case 11,450, he had some 17 problems with the current land owner in order to gain 18 access to that well in order to try to bring it back into production. And if he can't, he will try to plug it. And 19 both -- And I agreed to his request for a 90-day period in 20 the order that is issued in order to allow him to do this. 21 22 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. Do you have anything 23 further, Mr. Carroll? MR. CARROLL: No, Mr. Examiner, I rest. 24

EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. Mr. Robinson, I've got

a question here. 2 EXAMINATION BY EXAMINER STOGNER: 3 On the Palmer well -- and I'm looking at the copy 4 of the -- It looks like a USGS topo map. Have you got that 5 in front of you? 6 7 Α. Yes, sir. And you show the municipal airport and then the 8 east -- I'm sorry, the west side of Farmington? 9 Α. Right. 10 And the location of this well is shown by -- It's 11 Q. almost in the center, and it's a little bit south and west 12 of a thing called the drive-in theater that's marked; is 13 that correct? 14 Yes, sir. 15 Okay. What's the present status or condition of 16 this wellbore and the surface location of this well? 17 The well is -- There's tubing in the hole, and Α. 18 rods. The last time I saw it, there was tubing and rods in 19 the well. 20 21 Was there a pumpjack on the location? When I first started there was a pumpjack, and I 22 Α. 23 believe there was a tank. But on our last inspection Mr. Abbott called and 24 said that all of the equipment had been stolen on both 25

So there's no pumpjack. All that's there is just 1 wells. the wellhead and the tubing. 2 Did he have any knowledge of who stole them? 3 No, he said he had turned it in to the Sheriff's 4 Α. Department, and they haven't come up with anything. 5 Okay. Is there a wellhead on this -- on the 6 Q. surface? 7 Yes, sir. 8 Α. So as far as any exposed pipe or exposed casing, 9 Q. is that sufficiently covered up where any big objects 10 wouldn't happen to fall down into the hole? 11 12 Α. Right. Okay. What is the terrain around the Northeast 13 Q. Hogback State New Mexico Number 1? What's its location? 14 15 Α. Well, it's in an isolated area. There's not much around it. 16 Is it near the San Juan River, or is it away from 17 the river valley? 18 No, sir, it's away from the river. The Palmer is 19 the one by the river. 20 21 EXAMINER STOGNER: I have no further questions of Mr. Robinson, Mr. Carroll. Do you have anything further of 22 this witness? 23 MR. CARROLL: Nothing further, Mr. Examiner. 24

EXAMINER STOGNER: Does anybody else have

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anything further in either Case 11,449 or 11,450?
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                 If not, Mr. Robinson, you may be excused, and
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     thank you very much.
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                 THE WITNESS:

                 EXAMINER STOGNER: And with that, Cases 11,449
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     and 11,450 will be taken under advisement.
