This matter came on for hearing before the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division, MICHAEL E. STOGNER, Hearing Examiner, on Thursday, March 7th, 1996, at the New Mexico Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department, Porter Hall, 2040 South Pacheco, Santa Fe, New Mexico, Steven T. Brenner, Certified Court Reporter No. 7 for the State of New Mexico.

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1	WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at
2	11:54 a.m.:
3	EXAMINER STOGNER: At this time I'll call Case
4	Number 11,490, which is in the matter of the hearing called
5	by the Oil Conservation Division on our own motion to
6	permit the operator, Salkar, Inc Is that how you
7	pronounce it, Mr
8	MR. CARROLL: Salkar is how we've been
9	EXAMINER STOGNER: Salkar, Inc., the Travelers
10	Indemnity Company, and all other interested parties to
11	appear and show cause why a certain well in Eddy County,
12	New Mexico, should not be properly plugged and abandoned in
13	accordance with our rules and regulations.
14	At this time I'll call for appearances.
15	MR. CARROLL: May it please the Examiner, my name
16	is Rand Carroll and I represent the Oil Conservation
17	Division.
18	I have one witness to be sworn.
19	EXAMINER STOGNER: Any other appearances?
20	There being, none, Mr. Smith, I'm going to have
21	you sworn in at this time.
22	THE WITNESS: All right.
23	(Thereupon, the witness was sworn.)
24	EXAMINER STOGNER: Mr. Carroll?
25	MR. CARROLL: Thank you.

1	D. RAY SMITH (Present by telephone),
2	the witness herein, after having been first duly sworn upon
3	his oath, was examined and testified as follows:
4	DIRECT EXAMINATION
5	BY MR. CARROLL
6	Q. Mr. Smith, will you please state your name and
7	your residence for the record?
8	A. My name is Ray Smith, I live in Artesia, New
9	Mexico.
10	Q. Mr. Smith, will you please set forth the name of
11	your employer and your position with that employer?
12	A. I work for the Oil Conservation Division, the
13	State of New Mexico, in the Artesia District.
14	Q. And what's your position with the OCD?
15	A. Field Rep II.
16	Q. And does your duties as Field Rep II include the
17	overseeing of the plugging of abandoned wells?
18	A. Yes, it does.
19	Q. And have you had a chance to testify before this
20	Division before as to the plugging of wells in your
21	district, and have you had your qualifications accepted
22	regarding that testimony?
23	A. Yes, I have.
24	MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, I offer is Mr.
25	Smith's qualifications acceptable?

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1	EXAMINER STOGNER: They are, and Mr. Smith is so
2	qualified.
3	Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Smith, if you'll please
4	refer to what has been marked Exhibit Number 1 in Case
5	11,490, regarding the Salkar El Cheapo Number 1 well
6	A. Yes, sir.
7	Q have you investigated this matter, and do you
8	have certain recommendations regarding the plugging of this
9	well?
10	A. Yes, I do.
11	Q. Mr. Smith, will you please go through the history
12	of the El Cheapo Number 1, referring to the pages of
13	Exhibit Number 1?
14	A. Okay. I have a little synopsis here. I can read
15	a little bit about the history too.
16	Q. That will be fine.
17	A. Okay. The well was spud 3-27 of 1985 in the
18	Artesia Queen-Grayburg-San Andres Pool. It's a 12 1/4
19	hole, it was drilled to 306 feet, ran 8 5/8 casing to 278
20	feet and circulated to surface with cement.
21	On 4-22-85, they TD'd the hole at 2220 feet,
22	plugged it back to 2140 feet and ran 4 1/2 casing to 2140
23	and circulated cement to surface. The well was perforated
24	from 1516 to 1953 feet.
25	Surface equipment is limited to wellhead with a

1	polish rod sticking up and an old low 250 tank location,
2	reserve pitcher still open.
3	Q. Okay. What's the current condition of this well
4	that you feel it requires plugging?
5	A. I feel like it would probably jeopardize fresh
6	water in the locality and also jeopardize correlative
7	rights. The well is just setting dormant.
8	Q. So in your opinion, the plugging of this well at
9	this point in time would prevent waste, protect correlative
10	rights and/or fresh water and the environment?
11	A. Yes, I do.
12	Q. Mr. Smith, where are your plugging procedures set
13	forth? Are they on page 2 of Exhibit Number 1?
14	A. Yes, it is.
15	Q. And that's how you recommend that whoever is
16	hired to plug this well should plug it?
17	A. Right.
18	Q. Mr. Smith, what attempts have been made to
19	contact the last known operator of this well?
20	A. Yes, I've sent a letter to Salkar, Incorporated,
21	P.O. Box 1151, Artesia, by certified mail, January 3 of
22	1996. It was returned unopened and stating giving Rule
23	202 A or excuse me, 201 A, 201 B, and that the well
24	would need to be properly P-and-A'd or plugged.
25	Q. Okay. Mr. Smith, are you aware is there any

1	bond covering this well? Mr. Smith, I'll refer you to
2	Exhibit Number 2.
3	A. Okay.
4	Q. Does that set forth information regarding the
5	bond that covers this well?
6	A. Yes, it is.
7	Q. And there's a \$5000 one-well surety bond?
8	A. That is correct.
9	MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, I'll also refer you
10	to what has been marked OCD Exhibit Number 3, which is a
11	copy of the notice that was sent to both the Travelers
12	Indemnity and Salkar, Inc., and I've also submitted an
13	affidavit regarding the notice sent in this case.
14	I will bring up one small problem. Even though
15	on the return receipt card we have the correct state of the
16	Traveler's Indemnity Company, it is Farmington,
17	Connecticut, where it is located, and whoever prepared the
18	envelope put Farmington, New Mexico, and it was returned as
19	undeliverable.
20	Because there is an active bond in this case, I
21	would ask that this case be readvertised for a month, and
22	we will send a copy of the notice to the Traveler's
23	Indemnity Company in Farmington, Connecticut, so if they
24	have any objections or wish to appear in this case they
25	may.

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EXAMINER STOGNER: So you're prepared to continue 1 this until what? April 4th --2 3 MR. CARROLL: Right. 4 EXAMINER STOGNER: -- 1996, at which time it will be taken under advisement --5 6 MR. CARROLL: That's correct. 7 EXAMINER STOGNER: -- due to notification? 8 MR. CARROLL: And at this time I'd like to offer what has been marked OCD Exhibits Number 1 through 3 into 9 the record. 10 EXAMINER STOGNER: Exhibits 1 through 3 will be 11 admitted into the record at this time. 12 MR. CARROLL: And that's all I have in this case. 13 14 EXAMINATION BY EXAMINER STOGNER: 15 Mr. Smith, in looking at the completion report nd 16 0. 17 other items, are you familiar or have you ever run across the Mr. Salkar -- it looks like maybe Jimmie Salkar -- or 18 some of the other people that had signed these documents? 19 20 Α. No, I have not, Mr. Examiner. 21 Q. Okay. Now, you caused this matter to be sent to an Artesia address? 22 23 Α. Yes, I did. 24 Did you check with that Roswell address that was Q. on the C-101 and C-105? 25

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1	A. I must not have.
2	Q. I notice that there was a change, but there
3	hasn't been that much time lapse from Well, in fact,
4	that looked like it was approved in August, so the Roswell
5	address was probably more current than the Artesia address.
6	MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, we can also send a
7	copy of the notice, since we're readvertising in a month
8	anyway, to the Roswell address for Salkar.
9	EXAMINER STOGNER: Let's do that, and let's see
10	if we get any response.
11	Q. (By Examiner Stogner) Was there any other
12	attempts made to locate this company, Mr. Smith?
13	A. No, at the time This is the only address I've
14	noticed, but I do see a Roswell address here.
15	FURTHER EXAMINATION
16	BY MR. CARROLL:
17	Q. And Mr. Smith, it appears that Jimmie Salazar
18	with Salazar Brothers, Inc., is probably the "Sal" in this
19	"Salkar, Inc." I don't know if Jimmie Salazar is still
20	around Roswell or Artesia.
21	Are you familiar with Mr. Salazar, Mr. Smith?
22	A. I'm familiar with the Salazar Drilling Company.
23	MR. CARROLL: Okay.
24	EXAMINER STOGNER: We might want to check that
25	lead out.

And there's a Mary L. Karr, which appears to be 1 the secretary that had signed some of the other documents, 2 that might be the "Salkar" in this instance. 3 4 But anyway since we're going to leave the record open pending further notification, I don't have anything 5 further of Mr. Smith. 6 That's all I have, Mr. Examiner. 7 MR. CARROLL: EXAMINER STOGNER: Thank you, Mr. Smith, you may 8 be excused. 9 I believe we're going to have him in another 10 11 case --12 MR. CARROLL: Yes. 13 EXAMINER STOGNER: -- is that correct? 14 So stand by, Mr. Smith. 15 THE WITNESS: All right. EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, if there's nothing 16 further at this time, Mr. Carroll, we'll continue this case 17 to the April 4th, 1996, docket, at which time we will call 18 it, and perhaps if you want to present additional testimony 19 20 at that time, if need be. 21 MR. CARROLL: Okay. Thank you, Mr. Examiner. (Thereupon, these proceedings were concluded at 22 23 12:05 p.m.) 24 * * * 25
