WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 2 9:05 a.m.: CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Okay, so now we shall Call Case 3 Number 11,705, which is the Application of the Oil 4 5 Conservation Division to amend Order R-8170, pertaining to the General Rules of Prorated Fields of New Mexico. 7 Appearances in Case 11,705? MR. CARROLL: May it please the Commission, my 8 name is Rand Carroll, appearing on behalf of the Division. 9 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Mr. Carroll, thank you. 10 Any other appearances in the case? 11 Do you have any witnesses today, Mr. Carroll? 12 MR. CARROLL: No, I just have a brief statement. 13 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Okay, for those of you that are 14 curious about this particular Application, I think it has 15 to do with a suggestion to relax the testing requirements, 16 the deliverability testing requirements in the San Juan 17 Basin. 18 I think Mr. Carroll will kind of brief the 19 Commissioners, and I will appoint a committee to look into 20 what tests can be relaxed and what kind of information we 21 will need, and that committee will report back to us in a 22 23 couple months, I understand. 24 Mr. Carroll? 25 MR. CARROLL: You stole most of my thunder, Mr.

Chairman.

CHAIRMAN LEMAY: I'm sorry, I -- just setting the stage for you, sir.

MR. CARROLL: I have an e-mail message from Frank
Chavez in our Aztec District Office, and he has been
speaking with members of industry, and there's a consensus
that the proration rules for the northwest should be
amended.

As the memo points out, there's declining productivity of wells in the northwest, and that the current proration formula for pools in the northwest may no longer be applicable. There are very few wells that can make the allowable up in the northwest, but deliverability tests are still required, although there is a moratorium in effect right now, that places a moratorium on deliverability testing.

The Division and industry consider a lot of this testing unnecessary and a burden on both the OCD and the industry. So the purpose of the Application is to decrease the amount of gas well deliverability testing required and review the basis for such testing.

The OCD therefore requests that a committee chaired by the OCD be set up with operator and pipeline representatives and any other interested parties, maybe the BLM, to address current reservoir and market conditions and

to assure that waste is prevented and correlative rights 1 2 are protected. And that's all I have. 3 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Is it then your recommendation 4 that a committee be appointed and that that committee come 5 back to the Commission with recommendations for different 6 testing? Any time schedule on that? 7 8 MR. CARROLL: Yeah, I guess we would like to see 9 a new rule in effect by the end of summer, early fall. 10 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Do you have a suggestion when this case should be continued until, then? June hearing? 11 Is that something that -- July? 12 13 MR. CARROLL: Let's make it July. CHAIRMAN LEMAY: July? Okay, we don't have a 14 date yet in July, but we will have one. 15 16 Is it also your intent to, when you get a case like this, that -- it could be a rule and should be a rule 17 that the order be changed to a rule rather than keep it as 18 an order, like 8170? 19 20 MR. CARROLL: That's correct. Once we make this amendment and once we amend our order, the State Record 21 Center requires that orders such as this become rule, so 22 this will become a rule that will be placed in the rule 23 24 book, the proration rule. 25 So I think for -- Hopefully the committee will

come up with a draft rule we can attach to the docket for 1 2 July. CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Okay. Any -- Will you take any 3 questions from the Commissioners at this time? 4 MR. CARROLL: I'll attempt to answer them. 5 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Okay. Commissioner Weiss? 6 COMMISSIONER WEISS: I'm concerned that some 7 8 pressure data be maintained. Up there in the San Juan 9 Basin, we're fortunate to have maintained these records 10 over the years, and the companies up there can do real reservoir engineering because they have pressure 11 12 information and they know the volumes. 13 I can certainly understand the need to reduce the testing that's not necessary, but we certainly don't want 14 to eliminate it. We need to keep track of bottomhole 15 16 pressure in those reservoirs. MR. CARROLL: I think, Commissioner Weiss, that 17 is one of the concerns of the OCD and industry, that the 18 19 pressure data is helpful and necessary in what needs to be retained and what can be done away with. 20 I don't know --21 It is up to the study of the committee. CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Commissioner Bailey? 22 23 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: No, I just second Mr. 24 Weiss's concerns. CHAIRMAN LEMAY: We shall appoint a committee, 25
