APPLICATION

Comes now NEARBURG PRODUCING COMPANY ("Nearburg") by and through its attorneys, KELLAHIN and KELLAHIN, and applies to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ("NMOCD") for an unorthodox gas well location in order to produce its Dorami "33" Federal Com Well No. 1 which was drilled to the Morrow formation at a point 800 feet from the west line and 1800 feet from the south line (Unit L) of Section 33, Township 19 South, Range 25 East, NMPM, said location being unorthodox for gas production from the Cemetery-Morrow Gas Pool to be dedicated to a 320-acre gas spacing unit consisting of the S/2 of said Section 33.

In support thereof, Applicant states:

- 1. Applicant, Nearburg, is the operator of the Dorami "33" Federal Com Well No. 1 which was approved by the Division and drilled to test the Cisco Canyon formation at a location 800 feet from the west line and 1800 south line (Unit L) of Section 33, T19S, R25E, Eddy County, New Mexico.
- 2. Upon reaching the Cisco Canyon formation, it was determined that the well would not make a commercial well in the Cisco Canyon formation and Nearburg received permission from the Division to continue to drill the well and deepened it to the Morrow formation.
- 3. The well is capable of producing gas from the Cemetery-Morrow Gas Pool and has been shut-in awaiting the Division's decision on this application.

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- 4. Approval of this application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas underlying this unit, will prevent the economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.
- 5. Notification of this application has been sent to all adjoining and offsetting operators as set forth on Exhibit "A" attached.

WHEREFORE, Applicant requests that, after notice and hearing, this Application be approved as requested.
