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WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 9:00 a.m.

chairman wrotenbery: We'll call this meeting to order. Good morning everybody. It's 9:00 a.m. on November 16th, 1998. This is a meeting of the Oil Conservation Commission. We're here in the Oil Conservation Division's meeting rooms in Santa Fe, New Mexico.

We have, I believe, really just one matter that's ready to go forward today, but we have a few business items that we need to take care of first.

Let me say my name is Lori Wrotenbery, I'm

Chairman of the Oil Conservation Commission. To my left is

Commissioner Bill LeMay, and to my right is Commissioner

Jami Bailey representing Land Commissioner Ray Powell.

To Commissioner Bailey's right is Florene

Davidson, the Commission secretary. And to Commissioner

LeMay's left is Lyn Hebert, the Commission's legal counsel.

Also to Ms. Hebert's left is Steve Brenner, who will be recording these proceedings for us here today.

I believe the first item of business, we have minutes of several past Commission meetings that we need to catch up on here today. First of all, we have the minutes of the meeting of the Oil Conservation Commission held on September 9th, 1998. This was the Commission's meeting at Artesia, New Mexico, the Industry Speaks - OCC Listens

1	meeting. Commissioners, I believe you've had a chance to
2	review the minutes of that meeting. I'll entertain a
3	motion to adopt them.
4	COMMISSIONER LEMAY: Madame Chair, I move
5	adoption of the minutes as modified.
6	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I second.
7	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: All in favor say "Aye".
8	COMMISSIONER LEMAY: Aye.
9	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye.
10	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Aye. And don't think I
11	hear any no's.
12	We also have the minutes of the Oil Conservation
13	Commission meeting held on September 10th, 1998, here in
14	Santa Fe. Once again, I believe that you all have had an
15	opportunity to review the minutes.
16	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes.
17	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Anybody like to move
18	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I move that we accept the
19	minutes of that
20	COMMISSIONER LEMAY: I second.
21	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: All in favor say "Aye".
22	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye.
23	COMMISSIONER LEMAY: Aye.
24	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Aye.
25	And then finally we have the minutes of the Oil

Conservation Commission meeting held on October 15th, 1998. 1 This is the meeting -- I was here in the conference room 2 here, and Commissioners Bailey and LeMay participated by 3 telephone conference at that short meeting. And again I 4 believe you have seen the minutes. 5 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: I have and I move approval 6 of the meeting -- of the minute -- meeting --7 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I second. 8 9 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: -- meeting -- meeting minutes. 10 All in favor say 11 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Yes. 12 "Aye". 13 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Ave. 14 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: Aye. 15 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Aye. Okay, let me find 16 those right quick and get those finished. 17 And then just for the record, we have several cases that were either dismissed or continued, and let me 18 summarize those quickly. First of all, Cases Number 19 20 11,958, 11,959 and 11,934 have all been dismissed. 11,958 was the Application of Ocean Energy, Inc., for compulsory 21 pooling and an unorthodox well location in Lea County, New 22 Mexico. And this case has been dismissed. There's a copy 23 of the letter of dismissal in your notebooks, 24 Commissioners. It was dated November 4th, 1998. 25

Case 11,959 was the Application of Ocean Energy, 1 Inc., for compulsory pooling, Lea County, New Mexico. 2 Again, by letter dated November 4th, 1998, this case was 3 dismissed, and a copy is in your notebooks, Commissioners. 4 And Case Number 11,934, the Application of Yates 5 Petroleum Corporation for compulsory pooling in Lea County, 6 7 New Mexico, this case was dismissed. This letter of dismissal went out November 13th, 1998, and you have a copy 8 of that as well. 9 We also had on our agenda for today Case Number 10 11,839, the Application of Odessa Oil Investments, Inc., 11 for saltwater disposal in Eddy County, New Mexico. 12 particular Application has been continued to December 16th, 13 1998, the Commission's hearing on that date, at the request 14 of the Applicant. 15 And then also Case 12,086, the Application of 16 Yates Petroleum Corporation and Hanley Petroleum, Inc., for 17 allowable reduction and the escrow of production process in 18 Lea County, New Mexico, this case too has been continued to 19 the Commission's meeting on December 16th at the request of 20 the Applicant. 21 (Thereupon, these proceedings were concluded at 22 23 9:05 a.m.) 24
