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WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 2 9:35 a.m.: EXAMINER STOGNER: We're going to vary from the 3 4 order a little bit and at this time call Case 11,949. 5 MR. CARROLL: Application of Thornton Operating 6 Corporation to amend Division Order Number R-9514-C, Chaves County, New Mexico. 7 8 EXAMINER STOGNER: Call for appearances. 9 MR. CARR: May it please the Examiner, my name is 10 William F. Carr with the Santa Fe law firm Campbell, Carr, 11 Berge and Sheridan. We represent Thornton Operating 12 Corporation, and I have a statement I'd like to make at this time. 13 14 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. Any other appearances? Mr. Carr? 15 16 MR. CARR: Mr. Stogner, by Order Number R-9514-C, 17 dated June the 5th, 1997, the Oil Conservation Commission, among other things, authorized Thornton Operating 18 Commission to re-enter its McClellan Federal Well Number 1 19 20 A, located in Section 23 of Township 13 South, Range 29 East, and directionally drill that well to an unorthodox 21 bottomhole location. 22 23 While drilling, the Devonian was encountered at a higher depth than anticipated, and consequently the 24 wellbore, the horizontal portion of it, or the directional 25

portion of it, didn't reach the target area. It was less 1 unorthodox than originally approved but in conversations 2 with the Division, Thornton was advised that the original 3 order needed to be amended to reflect the location. 4 The current bottomhole location, the actual 5 bottomhole location, is a point 68 feet from the south line 6 7 and 260 feet from the west line of Section 23. We have, at the request of the Division, 8 renotified all owners who were notified of the original 9 case, which included all operators in the South Lone Wolf-10 11 Devonian Pool, and I would like to tender to you a copy of my notice affidavit with attached return receipts and the 12 notice letter and request that that be included in the 13 record and that the case be taken under advisement. 14 15 EXAMINER STOGNER: Mr. Carr, bring me up to date. 16 Order Number 9514-C was issued on June 5th; is that 17 correct? Right, of 1997. 18 MR. CARR: 19 EXAMINER STOGNER: Was that prior to our new Rule 111 being adopted for directional drilling? 20 21 MR. CARR: I don't know. EXAMINER STOGNER: Was there a provision in that 22 23 order that laid out what the bottomhole location was to be? MR. CARR: Yes, it was to be at a target area 24 25 within a hundred feet of a point 148 feet from the south

1	line and 177 feet from the west line of Section 23. And
2	the purpose here, really, is to make the actual wellbore
3	and order conform.
4	EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. I just had handed to
5	me, on July 14th, 1997, the New Mexico Oil Conservation
6	Commission revised those rules, and this order was issued
7	prior to that one.
8	There was a restriction on the windows or
9	bottomhole location targets. So this particular well was
10	outside that particular area that was designated by the
11	order; is that correct?
12	MR. CARR: Correct.
13	EXAMINER STOGNER: So at this time, and not
14	having the order and not having anything in front of me,
15	this is less unorthodox than what was provided.
16	MR. CARR: That is right.
17	EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. And the notification
18	you've given me, that's all offset operators?
19	MR. CARR: We went to all offset operators. We
20	also notified all operators in the South Lone Wolf-Devonian
21	Pool because they were involved in the original case, and
22	we had notified them before, so we covered all bases.
23	We've provided notice to all parties notified of the
24	original hearing.
25	EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. Does anybody else have

anything further in this matter? 1 Then Case Number 11,949 will be taken under 2 advisement. 3 4 MR. CARR: Thank you. 5 EXAMINER STOGNER: Thank you, Mr. Carr.
