Case 11998: Application of Costilla Energy, Inc. for compulsory pooling, Eddy County, New Mexico. Applicant seeks an order pooling all mineral interests from the surface to the base of the Chester series or formation underlying the following described acreage in Section 33, Township 16 South, Range 26 East, NMPM, and in the following manner: The N% of Section 33 to form a standard 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit for any formations and/or pools developed on 320-acre spacing within said vertical extent, including the POW-Morrow Gas Pool and Undesignated P.O.W.-Strawn Gas Pool; the NW% of Section 33 to form a standard 160-acre gas spacing and proration unit for any formations and/or pools developed on 160-acre spacing within said vertical extent; and the SE%NW% of Section 33 to form a standard 40-acre oil spacing and proration unit for any formations and/or pools developed on 40-acre spacing within said vertical extent.
