Regarding our conversation about the above case, I propose the following:

- 1. The Division's order can require Cross Timbers to apply to the Aztec District Office for administrative approval of directional drilling. I will request Cross Timbers to reference the above case and the proposed drilling window, described in ¶2 below, in the application.
- 2. The drilling window for the well can be a rectangle bounded as follows:

1190 feet FSL 1450 feet FEL 850 feet FSL 2510 feet FEL

This window limits the much larger drilling window described in the advertisement, the wellbore (in the Paradox and Dakota/Morrison) will not cross a quarter-quarter section line, and will keep any future uphole completion in the Dakota/Morrison at an orthodox location.
