WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 9:17 a.m.:

CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, and the next item is Case 12,117, this is the matter of the hearing called by the Oil Conservation Division to amend 19 NMAC 15.C.107.J and K of its rules pertaining to tubing and casing sizes and giving the Districts authority to grant administrative exceptions. Copies of the proposed rule changes were circulated with the docket for this meeting.

Mr. Carroll, would you like to lay this one out for us.

MR. CARROLL: May it please, the Commission, my name is Rand Carroll, appearing on behalf of the Oil Conservation Division. I don't think I'll need a witness today for this case.

What Mike's passing out has been marked OCD Exhibit Number 1, and that is our proposed rule change. The draft order I've submitted repeals 107.K, so the only thing left to be done would be amending 107.J.

There is a slight change from the proposed rule that was circulated with the docket, and that's in paragraph 5, where the words "at its discretion" were deleted. Since the word "may" is in that sentence, "at its discretion" is somewhat redundant.

Madame Chairman, you had asked last month at the

1 Commission Hearing whether paragraph 5 was even necessary. After discussing it yesterday with the District 2 Supervisors, we could go either way, but we decided to 3 leave it in. So if you decide to delete paragraph 5 from 4 5 the adopted rule, that would be fine with the Division. And in the last month, I am not aware of any 6 7 comments received from industry or other interested parties 8 as to the rule change. 9 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Any questions? Just to clarify on paragraph number 5, the 10 purpose of leaving it in is just to make sure everybody's 11 aware that the District Supervisor --12 MR. CARROLL: Well, it's to give industry notice 13 that they can bypass the Supervisor or, you know, go above 14 his head to you directly, if the operator so desires. 15 16 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: If we took that paragraph out, Rand, you'd still be -- Isn't it in the rules that 17 18 they had that right anyways, to be able to do that? MR. CARROLL: Yeah, that's why it's somewhat --19 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: -- maybe redundant? 20 21 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I always like to have a process outlined for everyone in case of protest, so they 22 know what the procedures are, if they're --23 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Just to make it clear for 24 everybody? 25

COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Just to make it clear. 1 2 MR. CARROLL: Yeah, not everybody checks, you 3 know, the front of the rule book to see what their rights 4 are, but if it's spelled out in various sections, that they look at what well tubing requirements are, they'll see that 5 and then they'll see they have the right to go to the 6 7 Director. It can't hurt, it just clutters up the rule book, 8 And it serves some purpose; some people might get 9 notice that wouldn't get notice of their rights otherwise. 10 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: That makes sense, need to 11 12 have it all in once place. Okay, Commissioners, you received right before 13 the meeting a copy of the draft order of the Commission in 14 this matter. Would you like to take a minute to --15 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I have had a chance to 16 17 review it, I do intend to sign it. COMMISSIONER LEMAY: Likewise, Madame Chair, we 18 reviewed the order as presented this morning, and it's my 19 20 intention to sign that order. CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: I'll entertain a motion 21 that the Commission adopt this order. 22 23 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I move that we adopt this order as presented this morning. 24 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: I second. 25

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CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: All in favor say "aye".

# 107.J. Well Tubing Requirements

Exh.6. + # /

- (1) All flowing oil wells equipped with casing larger in size than 2 7/8-inch OD shall be tubed.
- (2) All gas wells equipped with casing larger in size than 3-1/2 inch OD shall be tubed.
- (3) Tubing shall be set as near the bottom as practical and tubing perforations shall not be more than 250 feet above top of pay zone.
- (4) The supervisor of the appropriate Division district office, upon application, may grant exceptions to these requirements, provided waste will not be caused.
- (5) The supervisor or an operator may request that an application be reviewed by the Director. The operator shall submit information and give notice as requested by the Director. Unprotested applications may be approved after 20 days of receipt of the application and supporting information. If the application is protested, or the Director so decides, the application shall be set for hearing.
