WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 9:04 a.m.:

CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: And then we need to wrap up business today in Case 12,333. This is the Application of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division to amend Division Rules 103 and 202.

The Commission heard testimony on this particular Application at its last hearing on January 21st. At the end of that hearing, we continued the case for additional comment. We requested that comments be submitted -- by last Friday, I believe, Florene? And we didn't receive any formal written comments.

I did get an e-mail message from Rick Foppiano indicating that he had circulated the proposed changes among the NMOGA Regulatory Practices Committee, and he didn't receive any comments back. So he says if the OCD and the Oil Conservation Commission think that these changes are necessary, they could work on them.

And I believe we had a couple of questions pending from the last meeting. Ms. Hebert, do you want to address those?

MS. HEBERT: Commissioner Bailey, at the last meeting, inquired as to why the change is being made from 60 to 90 days on the sign change, when there's been a change of operator name, and whether or not it was intended

to leave out the no-exceptions provision for that, or have an extension with good cause.

I talked with District Supervisor Chris Williams, and it was at his request that the change be made from 60 days to 90 days, because he was receiving so many requests for extensions of time, and he felt by extending it to 90 days it would cut down on those numbers of extension.

He said he didn't feel strongly about continuing the provision of an extension with good cause shown. So the rule as it now appears has the 90-day provision as well as an extension for good cause shown.

The other question I believe Commissioner Bailey had was as to whether the Rule 202 and other of our rules would be applicable to the general public, as opposed to just permitees of OCD. And under the Oil and Gas Act, the Oil and Gas Act and the rules promulgated under that act are applicable to the general public in the State of New Mexico.

So I don't think that we should have any problem with the below-ground or the above-ground clauses.

CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Thank you. And we did circulate a draft of the order of the Commission approving this Application and amending Division Rules 103 and 202 concerning well signs and plugged-and-abandoned markers.

Commissioners, have you had a chance to review
