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WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 2 9:00 a.m.: CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: I think we can go back on 3 the record here. It's Wednesday morning, December 5th. 4 5 took me a minute to remember exactly what the date was. It's nine o'clock, and we're getting started again. 6 continuation of the hearing that we held yesterday. 7 8 a few more items on our agenda to take care of. 9 And one of those, I know, is the minutes of the 10 last meeting. I'd like to go back and pick those up if we 11 could and get that out of the way. 12 We have a draft of the minutes of the hearing of 13 the Oil Conservation Commission held on November 6th, 2001. 14 Commissioners, I believe you've had a chance to review 15 those? 16 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes, I have, and I move 17 that we adopt them. 18 COMMISSIONER LEE: Second. 19 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: All in favor say aye. 20 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. 21 COMMISSIONER LEE: Aye. CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Aye. And I'll sign those 22 23 on behalf of the Commission. 24 Thank you, Florene. 25

CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: And then we also had Case 12,698. This is the Application of Mewbourne Oil Company for compulsory pooling in Eddy County, New Mexico.

The Commission issued an order in that case at the meeting on November 6th, 2001, and since then we've had a request from the Applicant Mewbourne to re-open the case so we can consider amending one part of the order.

And I note we have here today Mr. Bruce representing Mewbourne.

I don't see Mr. Feldewert. Steve, do you know anything about his plans?

MR. ROSS: I had a conversation with Mr. Feldewert on Monday, reminding him that this matter was set during these hearings. And he said he was not going to appear, that his clients had no interest in participating in the well and he wasn't going to take a position for or against the proposal here today. And I presume that's why he's not here this morning.

CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, thank you.

Mr. Bruce, would you like to explain to us what it is you're seeking here today?

MR. BRUCE: Yes, Madame Chair. The Division entered a pooling order in this case in August, and Mewbourne Oil Company sent out the election letter as required by the pooling order.

During that 30-day election period, none of the pooled parties, which I would refer to as Heyco, et al., elected to join in the well, nor did they file any request with the Division or the Commission to stay the effect of the Division's order. If you'll recall, their primary issue at hearing was pooling limited zones. Because there was no response, all parties were deemed nonconsent as of the date of the Commission hearing.

At the Commission hearing, Mewbourne requested that the order provide for no additional election period, and Heyco, et al., did not object to that request, if I recall correctly. I believe just through simple oversight that provision was not in the order, so I sent a letter requesting on Mewbourne's behalf that the order be amended to provide for no additional election period.

Normally I wouldn't have done this, but due to rig scheduling the well was commenced. And Mr. Feldewert's letter to the Commission was kind of ambiguous. It said, We don't plan on participating, rather than a flat statement that they would not participate.

And because the well is drilling and the chance that information could escape about the condition of the well, we believe that it would be proper to amend the order to provide for no additional election period, since they did not elect during the original election period and no
