RE: Administrative application on behalf of Chaparral Energy, Inc. for a location exception (application reference No. pKRV0-134550740) filed with the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ("Division") on December 10, 2001 for its Crosby Deep Well No. 1 (API No. 30-025-23891) located at an unorthodox Devonian gas well location 330 feet from the South line and 1980 feet from the West line (Unit N) of Section 28, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. The SW/4 of Section 28 is to be dedicated to this well in order to form a standard 160-acregas spacing and proration unit for the Crosby-Devonian Gas Pool (see Division Rule 104, revised by Division Order No. R-11231, issued by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission in Case No. 12119 on August 12, 1999, and the Division Director's notice to all operators dated October 25, 1999).
