APPLICATION

Arch Petroleum Inc. applies for an order pooling all mineral leasehold interests from the surface to the base of the Teague (Simpson) Pool underlying the NW\(\frac{1}{2}\)Swy of Section 27, Township 23 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, and in support thereof, states:

- 1. Applicant is a working interest owner in the NW%SW% of Section 27, and has the right to drill a well thereon.
- 2. Applicant proposes to drill its E.C. Hill "C" Well No. 3, at an orthodox oil well location, to a depth sufficient to test the McKee formation, and seeks to dedicate the NW¼SW¼ of Section 27 to the well to form a standard 40 acre cil spacing and proration unit for any formations and/or pools developed on 40 acre spacing within that vertical extent, including the Teague (Simpson) Pool.
- 3. Applicant has in good faith sought to obtain the voluntary joinder of all other mineral leasehold interest owners in the NW4SW4 of Section 27 for the purposes set forth herein.
- 4. Although applicant attempted to obtain voluntary agreements from all mineral leasehold interest owners to participate in the drilling of the well or to otherwise commit their interests to the well, certain interest owners have failed or refused to join in dedicating their interests. Therefore, applicant seeks an order pooling all mineral leasehold interest

owners in the NW4SW4 of Section 27, pursuant to NMSA 1978 §70-2-17.

5. The pooling of all mineral leasehold interests underlying the NW\(\frac{1}{2}\)SW\(\frac{1}{2}\) of Section 27 will prevent the drilling of unnecessary wells, prevent waste, and protect correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, Applicant requests that, after notice and hearing, the Division enter its order:

- A. Pooling all mineral leasehold interests in the NW%SW% of Section 27, from the surface to the base of the Teague (Simpson) Pool;
- B. Designating applicant as operator of the well;
- C. Considering the cost of drilling and completing the well, and allocating the cost thereof among the well's working interest owners;
- D. Approving actual operating charges and costs charged for supervision, together with a provision adjusting said rates pursuant to the COPAS accounting procedure; and
- E. Setting a penalty for the risk involved in drilling and completing the well in the event a working interest owner elects not to participate in the well.
