In the matter of the application of the New Mexico Asphalt and Refining Company to amend Order No. 467 of this Commission to the end that the West Lusk Area and the Barber Area, Eddy County, New Mexico, (being asphaltic base production) be allowed to produce 100 barrels per day per unit of production for a limited period embracing the proration months of September, October and November, 1942, in order to fill the applicant's requirements of 1500 barrels daily of the type of crude oil produced in said areas for the purpose of maintaining deliveries of asphalt and road oils to the U. S. Army Engineers for air base projects throughout New Mexico and Texas. This case is set for 2 o'clock P. M., October 29, 1942.


