ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

By the Commission

This matter came on for hearing at 10:00 a. m. on February 20, 1951 at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the Commission.

NOW, on this 26th day of February 1951, the Commission having before it the testimony adduced at the hearing and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

1. That due public notice having been given, as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this case.
2. That the evidence shows conclusively that topographical conditions are such that a regular location would be difficult and expensive.
3. That the Morris No. 2 well location is upon Federal land and Federal officials present at the hearing interposed no objections to the proposed location.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the application of the Oil Conservation Commission, by request of Byrd-Frost, Inc., for an unorthodox well location for Byrd-Frost, Inc., Morris No. 2 well be and the same hereby is approved for:

Township 27 North, Range 10 West, N. M. P. M.
990 feet from the north line and 790 feet from the
west line of section 15.
