This cause came on regularly for hearing at 10:00 a. m., February 20, 1951, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, hereafter referred to as the "Commission."

NOW, on this 12th day of March 1951 the Commission having considered the testimony adduced at the hearing and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

.1. That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause.

2. That objections of Messrs. Chivers and Carson, filed in the cause, have been withdrawn, there are no offset owners and the application for the unorthodox location should be granted in view of the topographic conditions of the area.

3. A survey discloses the exact location to be 1763 feet west of the east line and 996 feet north of the south line section 17, T. 29 N, R. 13 W, N. M. P. M., San Juan County, New Mexico.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED: That the application of Paul B. Palmer, Associates, be and the same hereby is approved for its Hutton No. 1 well located 996 feet from the south line and 1763 feet from the east line (SW/4SE/4) section 17, T. 29 N, R. 13 W, San Juan County, New Mexico, for Pictured Cliffs production.
