

(Mr. Graham reads the notice of publication.)

R. S. BLYMN, having been first duly sworn, testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. WHITE:

Q Mr. Blymn, will you state your full name and position for the record, please?

A R.S. Blymn, engineer for the Oil Conservation Commission.

Q In your capacity as engineer for the Oil Conservation Commission, have you had occasion to make a study of proposed extensions and creations of new pools as read by Mr. Graham in this case, and if so, what are the result of your studies, and your recommendations?

A Yes, I have made a study of these proposed creations and extensions, and have prepared plats showing the proposed creations, and the proposed extensions. And I would like to make a recommendation that these various creations and extensions be adopted as advertised and as shown on these plats.
