Gentlemen:

Request is hereby made for permits to drill and produce two oil wells and to be allowed daily production from such wells in an amount of oil proportional to Standard Oil Proration Units on two Non-Standard Oil Proration Units.

Unit #1 provided for Well #1;
Lots I, 2, 3 & 4, Section 18, T. 26N., R. 13 W.,
N.M.P.M., San Juan County, New Mexico,
containing 60.84 acres, more or less.
(This strip is 489.72 feet wide at the north end and 514.14 feet wide at the south end).

Unit #2 provided for Well #2;
Lots I, 2, 3 & 4, Section 19, T. 26 N., R. 13 W.,
N.M.P.M., San Juan County, New Mexico,
containing 63.48 acres, more or less.

(This strip is 514.14 feet wide at the north end and 533.28 feet wide at the south end.)

Attached hereto and made a part hereof is a plat showing the lands described which was prepared by the San Juan Engineering Company.

The lands above described are owned by the United States of America and have been covered by one seperate and distinct oil and gas lease describing no other lands.

Said lands are presumed to be productive of oil and being drained by Skelly Oil Co. wells Nos. 15 and 16, both 660 feet from the East line of said lands, and British American Well No. 2 located 1980 feet from the west line on Navajo lands.

Each Non-Standard Unit lies wholly within a single government section and adjacent to the Navajo Reservation.

Unit #1 described above was assigned to John W. Sullivan and seggregated from the original lease including Unit #2, however, the applicant herein has been designated Operator of said Unit #1 and is both owner and operator of Unit #2.

British American and Skelly Oil Company are the only operators owning or operating wells or leases within 2640 feet of either of the herein described Non-Standard Units and copies of this application have been sent to both with the request that each of them notify the New Mexico Oil Conservation of their approval or disapproval of the application herein.

Application has been made with the U.S.G.S. for drilling said two wells and it is presumed that approval has reached the office of New Mexico Conservation Comm.

The applicant hereby requests an examiners hearing upon this application at the earliest possible date.
