ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a.m. on November 8, 1962, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Daniel S. Nutter, Examiner duly appointed by the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission," in accordance with Rule 1214 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.

NOW, on this 21st day of November, 1962, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the application, the evidence adduced, and the recommendations of the Examiner, Daniel S. Nutter, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Gulf Oil Corporation, seeks authority to complete its H. T. Mattern (NCT-A) Well No. 3, located in Unit P of Section 24, Township 21 South, Range 36 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico, as a triple completion (conventional) to produce oil from the Paddock, Blinbry, and Drinkard Oil Pools through parallel strings of 2 3/8-inch tubing, separation of the zones to be achieved by means of packers set at approximately 5800 feet and 6500 feet.
- (3) That the mechanics of the proposed triple completion are feasible and in accord with good conservation practices.
- (4) That approval of the subject application will neither cause waste nor impair correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- (1) That the applicant, Gulf Oil Corporation, is hereby authorized to complete its H. T. Mattern (NCT-A) Well No. 3, located in Unit P of Section 24, Township 21 South, Range 36 East,

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NMPN, Lea County, New Mexico, as a triple completion (conventional) to produce oil from the Paddock, Blinabry, and Drinkard Oil Pools through parallel strings of 2 3/8-inch tubing, separation of the zones to be achieved by means of packers set at approximately 5800 feet and 6500 feet.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That the applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission Rules and Regulations insofar as said rule is not inconsistent with this order.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That the applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Gas-Oil Ratio Test Period for the Drinkard Oil Pool.

(2) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.


