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two anomalies by a fault that trends northwest about three quarters of a mile north of the Wilson Well, labeled with the
 letter F.

The Wilson Well encountered numerous shows in the San Andres and Yeso and according to New Mexico Bureau of Mines Bulletin No. 9, the well encountered one million cubic feet of gas per day from either the base of the Yeso or upper Abo. The well was bottomed in the Fusselman, which yielded water, ending any further operations.

The well was commenced in about 1925 and was finished in about 1927.

East of the Unit the Sunray No. 1 New Mexico State AV in Section 22 of Township 17 South, Range 18 East was drilled to fifty-nine hundred and thirteen feet in the Pre-Cambrian. The commercial sample log on this well shows porosity and oil staining from the Yeso, Montoya and Ellenburger.

18 Q. Mr. Beck, would you generally tell the Hearing 19 Officer about the other wells that have been drilled in this 20 general area?

A. Outside of the map and up to about ten miles away from the proposed Dunken Well, other scattered wells have encountered shows and porosity in the San Andres, the Yeso, the Permian sands, the Penn sands, the Fusselman, Montoya, Ellenburger and Bliss. And some wells that have been drill-
