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MR. STAMETS: Call next case, Case 6061.

MS. TESCHENDORF: Case 6061, application of Yates
Petroleum Corporation for a unit agreement, Eddy County,
New Mexico.

MR. LOSEE: A. J. Losee, appearing on behalf of the applicant and we have one witness.

(THEREUPON, the witness was sworn.)

### GERALD W. BOOK

was called as a witness by the applicant, and having been first duly sworn, testified upon his oath as follows, to-wit:

# DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. LOSEE:

- Q. Would you state your name, please?
- A. My name is Gerald Book.
- Q. Do you live in Artesia?
- A. Yes, sir.
  - Q And what is your occupation?
- 20 A. I am a geologist with Yates Petroleum Corporation.
  - Q. You have not previously testified before this Commission as an expert witness?
- 23 A. No, sir, I have not.
  - Q. Where did you attend college for your higher education?

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A. I attended Southern Colorado State College, Pueblo, Colorado, where I received a Bachlor's Degree -- Bachlor of Science Degree in 1971, in Geology.

I attended Texas Tech in June of 1971, through September of 1973, in the Department of Geo-Sciences.

- Q. And you are a candidate for a Masters?
- A. Yes, I am. I am enrolled right now.
- Q. Since graduating from Texas Tech in 1973, in what line of work have you been engaged?
- A. I have worked for Yates Petroleum since January of 1974, as a geologist.
  - Q. In southeastern New Mexico?
  - A. Yes, southeastern New Mexico.
- MR. LOSEE: Mr. Examiner, are Mr. Book's qualifications acceptable?
  - MR. STAMETS: The witness is considered qualified.
- Q. (Mr. Losee continuing.) Are you familiar with the Stinking Draw Unit area and the matters contained in this application for approval of the unit?
  - A. Yes, I am.
- Q Is this form of unit agreement the one prescribed by the Bureau of Land Management, Department of Interior?
  - A. Yes, it is.
- Q. Has the unit area been designated by the U.S.

  Geological Survey as logically suitable for development under

a unit plan?

A. Yes, it has. Exhibit Number Three is a letter from the U. S. Geological Survey approving the Stinking Draw Unit as a logical unit area and approving the unit agreement which is Exhibit Number One.

- Q. Has the Commissioner of Public Lands of the State of New Mexico approved the form of the unit agreement?
- A. Yes, he has. Exhibit Number Two is a letter from the New Mexico Commissioner of Public Lands, Phil R. Lucero, approving the unit agreement as to form and content.
- Q. How many acres in the unit area are federal lands and how many are state lands, or percentage, either way?
- A. The total acreage in the unit is two thousand eight hundred and eighty acres, more or less, and two thousand five hundred sixty point six-four acres being federal land and being eighty-eight point eight-nine percent of the unit area.

The State of New Mexico lands are three hundred and twenty acres being eleven point eleven percent of the unit area.

- Q. Okay. Now, does Exhibit A to the unit agreement
  -- is that a map of the unit area?
- A. Yes, it is. Exhibit A shows the Stinking Draw
  Unit in Sections 3, 4, 9 and 10 and the north half of 16 of
  Township 21 South, Range 22 East, in Eddy County, New Mexico.

Exhibit B of the unit agreement is -- the unit agreement is Exhibit Number One -- is a schedule of land and leases in the Stinking Draw Unit with a number of leases corresponding to the tract number on Exhibit Number Eight.

It is expected that there will be one hundred percent of the working interests committed to the unit.

- Q. Now, Exhibit Four, being the geologic report on this unit was that prepared by you?
  - A. Yes, it was.
- Q. Would you tell the Examiner, briefly, what formations might -- possible productive formations -- might be encountered in drilling the initial test well?
- A. Okay. The productive formations -- the most promising productive horizon in the area is the Morrow Clastics zone.

It produces in the Hilliard Federal BF in Section 14.

The lower part of the log for the Hilliard Federal is on

Exhibit 6, which is a two-well stratigraphic section, AA

Prime, on Exhibit Number Five which is a structural map.

Other horizons in the area are the Atoka Clastics and the Strawn Clastics which are sporadic sands.

Also, carbonate reservoirs can be -- the area is in a suitable stratigraphic position for carbonate reservoirs in the Cisco Canyon and the Wolfcamp.

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So, there are a number of possible or potential reservoirs along with a favorable structural position of the unit. It is a highly potential hydrocarbon producing area.

- Q. How is the initial test well projected -- the Mississippian formation, the penetration of the Mississippian lime?
- A. The initial test well will be drilled to a depth of approximately ninety-five hundred feet. It will penetrate the San Andres, the Glorieta, Abo and Wolfcamp formations of the Permian Age and the Cisco Canyon, Strawn, Atoka and Morrow of the Pennsylvanian Age and bottom in the upper Mississippian.
- Q. Now, you previously testified, I believe, that you expect one hundred percent of the working interest owners to ratify the unit agreement.

Have you given the overriding royalty owners and the royalty owners the opportunity to join the unit?

- A. Yes, both have been contacted.
- Q In your opinion will the operation of this area, as the proposed unit, be in the interest of conservation and the prevention of waste?
- 23 A. Yes.
  - Q Exhibit Four was prepared by you, the geologic report, was it not?

A. Yes, it was.

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MR. LOSEE: We move the introduction of Exhibits
One through Four.

MR. STAMETS: These exhibits will be admitted.

MR. LOSEE: I have no further questions on direct.

MR. STAMETS: Any other questions of the witness?
Ms. Teschendorf?

MS. TESCHENDORF: In Section 10 of the unit agreement you are talking about plan of further development and operations and your plan says the unit operator shall submit for the approval of the supervisor of the U.S.G.S., Oil and Gas Supervisor, and the State Land Commissioner.

I don't see the O.C.C. in there and it seems to me to be a departure from common practice -- why wasn't the Oil Commission included?

MR. LOSEE: Well, do you want me to respond or let the witness?

MS. TESCHENDORF: I guess the witness, if he knows.

A. Could I talk to my lawyer?

MR. LOSEE: I don't really think this witness is qualified -- let me see if I can give a shot at it and I really didn't prepare this --

I don't want to disagree but I guess I really do -this is a plan of how many wells will be drilled in a calendaryear period. That's what paragraph ten is talking about.

At least in those units that I have prepared the concern about the number of wells has been left to the State Land Commissioner if state lands are involved and the federal government if federal lands are involved.

The responsibility of the Commission being not the number of wells but the manner in which they are drilled -- I may be wrong -- but I don't think the plan of development -- don't misunderstand me, the operator has no objection and he would furnish you a copy if production is obtained.

MR. STAMETS: Are there any other questions of the witness? Anything further in this case? We will take the case under advisement.

(THEREEUPON, the witness was excused and the case was concluded.)
