NEARBURG PRODUCING COMPANY, through its undersigned attorneys, hereby makes application pursuant to Oil Conservation Division Rule 111 to directionally drill its Western State 17-F Well No. 1 to an unorthodox bottomhole location in the Northeast Lovington Pennsylvanian Pool, and in support of this application states:

- 1. Applicant is the operator of the Northeast Lovington Pennsylvanian Pool, underlying the S/2 NW/4 of Section 17, Township 16 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico.
- 2. Applicant proposes to drill its Western State 17-F Well No. 1 at a standard surface location 2130 feet from the North and West lines of said Section 17 to an unorthodox bottomhole location within 50 feet of a point 2300 feet from the West line and 1980 feet from the North line of said Section 17 to test the Strawn formation, Northeast Lovington Pennsylvanian Pool.
- 3. Applicant proposes to dedicate to this well a standard 80-acre spacing unit described in Paragraph No. 1 of this application.

4. The subject well must be directionally drilled to enable the applicant to produce the reserves which underlie the above-described proration unit.

5. Approval of this Application will enable the Applicant to produce hydrocarbons that otherwise would not be produced and will otherwise be in the best interest of conservation, the prevention of waste and the protection of correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, Applicant requests that this matter be set for hearing before a duly appointed Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on November 28, 1990, after that notice and hearing as required by law and the rules of the Division, that the Division enter its Order granting this application.
