oath, testified as follows, to-wit:

Q Will you state your name and place of
residence?
A William H. Smith, Midland, Texas.

2	Q	And in what capacity?
3	A	Geologist.
4	Q	Have you previously testified before this
5	Commission or one	of its examiners?
	A	No.
6	Q	Would you summarize your educational
7	background and you	r work experience?
8	A	I received a BS degree in geology from
9	Muskingum College	in 1977 in New Concord, Ohio.
10		Received an MS degree from Wright State
11	University in Day	ton, Ohio in 1980 and have been employed
12	with Getty since.	
13	Q	Are you familiar with the application
14	filed in this case	on behalf of Getty?
	А	Yes.
15	Q	Are you familiar with the subject well?
16	A	Yes.
17		MR. CARR: Are the witness's
18	qualifications acc	eptable?
19		MR. STAMETS: They are.
20	Q	Will you briefly state what Getty seeks
21	with this applicat	ion?
22	А	We're seeking permission to drill a well
23	in a non-standard	location in the Indian Basin Field.
	Q	Have you prepared certain exhibits for
24	introduction in th	is case?
25	A	Yes.

2	Q Would you refer to what has been marked	
3	for identification as Getty Exhibit Number One and review	
4	this for Mr. Stamets?	
5	A This is a contour map of the this por-	
6	tion of the Indian Basin Field, contoured on the top of the	
	Upper Pennsylvanian carbonate.	
7	The blue circles indicate wells that have	
8	produced from the Pennsylvanian carbonate.	
9	The blue outline represents the original	
10	oil/water contact when the field was first discovered.	
11	The red outline indicates the present oil	
12	pardon me, I'm saying "oil", I mean gas/watergas/water	
13	contact as it stands now.	
14	The red square in the center there in	
	Section 32 represents the proposed location.	
15	Q Now, what acreage is dedicated to the	
16	proposed well? Or will be dedicated?	
17	A All 640 acres of Section 32.	
18	Q Now this is a structure map on the Upper	
19	Penn.	
20	A Yes.	
21	Q How important is structure in terms of	
22	making a successful well in the Upper Pennsylvanian?	
	A It's very important in this case. This	
23	is a water drive gas reservoir and the higher up structure	
24	that you can get, the longer you'll be able to produce your	
25	well water free.

2	Q In your opinion is the proposed location
3	the best location available to Getty to produce the reserves
4	in this formation under Section 32?
5	A Yes, it is.
6	Q Would you now refer to what has been
	marked for identification as Getty Exhibit Number Two,
7	identify this, and review it for Mr. Stamets?
8	A This is another contour map. This one is
9	represents the top of the Morrow structure in the area.
10	The pink circles represent wells that
11	have had poor that have poor Morrow reservoir properties
12	as determined by drill stem tests or completion attempts.
13	The blue circles represent wells that are
14	currently producing or have produced in the Morrow.
15	The orange outline represents a trend
	within the Morrow of production.
16	Q In your opinion could all of Section 32
17	contribute gas to the proposed well in the Morrow formation?
18	A Yes.
19	Q Is structure important in the in mak-
20	ing a successful well in the Morrow?
21	A No.
22	Q Were there any topographical considera-
23	tions that came into play in selecting this particular loca-
24	tion?
	A Yes. The area out there is quite hilly.
25	We will, in fact, be on the edge of a ridge.

2	Q Mr. Smith, the application is for the en-
3	tire Pennsylvanian section. Do you anticipate any produc-
4	tion in any zones other than the Upper Pennsylvanian or the
5	Morrow?
	A No, I do not.
6	Q On Exhibit Number One there are a number
7	of wells in the pink area on the east side of the map that
8	look as though they may be abandoned locations or shut-in
9	wells.
10	Just say, for example, down to the south
11	end of Section 8 there's an Amoco well. Is that well wat-
12	ered out now?
13	A They've stopped producing the wells, pre-
14	sumably because of increased water.
	And it's the same with the rest of the
15	wells in that pink trend.
16	Q And that would be true with the original
17	Hanagan Well in this section.
18	A That's correct.
19	MR. STAMETS: Any other ques-
20	tions of the witness? He may be excused.
21	Anything further in this case?
22	MR. CARR: Nothing further, Mr.
23	Stamets.
	MR. STAMETS: The case will be
24	taken under advisement.
25	(Hearing concluded.)
