




Regarding your recent request for information and appropriate action on the subject lease, we have determined that the only well on the lease that has not been plugged and abandoned is a well in the SE/4 SW/4 of Section 16. Despite our best efforts, however, we have been unable to determine who actually owns the wellbore.

According to our well file, LaJet, Inc. is the operator of record and although their plugging bond has been cancelled for future liability, it should still cover this well. It is our recommendation, therefore, that a show cause hearing be called to plug the well.
