APPLICATION

Comes now, ARCO OIL AND GAS CO., by its undersigned attorneys, and hereby makes application for an order designating a new pool as a result of the discovery of hydrocarbons in the Upper Pennsylvanian (Cisco) Formation in its Jackson Federal No. 1 Well located 660 feet from the North line and 2310 feet from the West line of Section 35, Township 17 South, Range 29 East, Eddy County, New Mexico, and for promulgation of special pool rules, including (1) 80-acre spacing or proration units on a permanent basis or, in the alternative, on a temporary basis, (2) the dedication of all of the E/2 NW/4 of said Section 35 to the Jackson Federal No. 1 Well, (3) special well location requirements, and (4) assignment of a discovery allowable to the Jackson Federal No. 1 Well, and in support of this application would show the Division:

1. Applicant has recently completed its Jackson Federal No. 1 Well in the Upper Pennsylvanian (Cisco) Formation capable of producing oil and gas in paying quantities located 660 feet from the North line and 2310 feet from the West line of Section 35,

Township 17 South, Range 29 East, Eddy County, New Mexico. Said well is producing through perforations from 9185 feet to 9215 feet and was potentialed as capable of producing 339 barrels of oil per day and 427 mcf of gas per day with 3 barrels of produced water.

2. Applicant believes that the following described lands are reasonably proven to be productive of oil and gas in paying quantities from the Upper Pennsylvanian (Cisco) Formation and should be included in the original definition of the new pool to be created because of said discovery:

Township 17 South, Range 29 East, N.M.P.M. Section 35: E/2 NW/4

- 3. In order to prevent economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, to avoid augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells and to otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights, special pool rules and regulations providing for 80-acre spacing units should be promulgated for the new pool.
- 4. Applicant requests that a discovery allowable be assigned to said Jackson Federal No. 1 Well.
- 5. Applicant also requests that special well location requirements be promulgated which provide for wells to be located on proration units consisting of the E/2 or W/2 of each quarter section and that the wells be located in either the NE/4 or the SW/4 of each quarter section.

WHEREFORE, Arco Oil and Gas Co. requests that this application be set for hearing before a duly appointed examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on March 13, 1985, that notice be given as required by law and the rules of the Division, and that the application be approved.
