	Q	Mr. Morton I m going to refer you to

what has been marked as Applicant's Exhibit Number A. and 1 ask if that was prepared by you or under your supervision? 2 It was prepared under my supervision. 3 Would you tell the Examiner what that ex-0 hibit purports to show? 5 The exhibits show that Amerada Hess 6 proposing to drill the Andrus Well, located in the north 7 half of the southwest quarter, and it also shows our mineral owners and working interest owners as Exhibit B. Q Let's just go with - let's just go with 10 that one for the time being. 11 Α Okay. 12 This well that you're proposing in the 13 northwest southwest of Section 9 is what kind southwest 14 of well? I mean what formation are you looking for? 15 Λ We're looking to drill a Strawn well 16 here. 17 Now, I refer you to Exhibit B and ask 0 18 what that exhibit purports to show. 19 That exhibit shows the mineral owners, 20 the working interest owners and the royalty interest owners, 21 in our proposed unit. And the ones that are marked 'No. 1'. are 0 23 those interests that we're seeking to force pool, is that 24 correct? 25

A Yes, and that is and that is the New Mexico Royalty Trust, Clarice Van Eman, William C. Uphoff.

Q And to add another unpronouncable name to the list is Alfred Letzenick.

It is my understanding, Mr. Morton, that we have — I guess I should ask this question first, is what efforts has Amerada Hess made to find these people?

A Well, under my direction Les Opperman, who has been out buying oil and gas leases for us in this particular prospect, has tried to located each of these individuals, referring to Uphoff, Letzenick, and Van Eman, and we have sent out certified letters out to these individuals as to their last known address.

We've gotten no response as far as that's concerned. We've gone to the different phone books in different cities that we believe these people were living in and we still could not find these individuals.

As far as the New Mexico Royalty Trust, the reason we're attempting to force pool this trust is because we -- we believe there's some doubt as to whether or not we're got this interest tied up.

When the trust was set up in 1932 Mr. Manley conveyed into the trust without his wife's execution of the deed, and because of that we think that this interest is tied into the College of the Southwest.

for precautionary reasons we would 1 like to go ahead and list that New Mexico Royalty Trust as a 2 respondent. 3 College of the Southwest has a --- has 0 leased, have they not? 5 Α Yes, we have a lease from the College of 6 Southwest. 7 Now is it my understanding that somebody 8 else within the last day or two has found Mr. Uphoff? Mr. Rowan advised us Friday of last week Α 10 he had contacted Mr. Uphoff and was attempting to get 11 an oil and gas lease with him, but as of today he has 12 taken a lease from Mr. Uphoff and Mr. Uphoff's interest is 13 not committed. 14 I want to refer you to Exhibit C, which I 15 assume are Mr. Opperman's notes on what he's -- how he's 16 tried to find these people. 17 Α Uh-huh. 18 Is that correct? 0 19 That's correct. Α 20 And Exhibit C-1 shows the letters that 21 you have sent to try to -- and have been returned with no -with no receipt. 23 That's correct. Α 24 Q Okay. I want to skip Exhibit D for 25

minute, if I can, Mr. Examiner, and D-1, and go to Exhibit E.

Was this — Exhibit E is a standard form operating agreement. Was that prepared either by you or under your supervision?

A It was prepared under my supervision.

Q And is this the operating agreement that you propose to use in connection with the drilling of this well?

A Yes.

Q Exhibit -- the COPAS provision to this lease, Section III, Overhead, suggests a drilling well rate and a producing well rate, is that correct?

A That's correct.

Q And what are those, Mr. Morton?

A Well, let me just say that we -- initially we were going to use a drilling rate of \$6,020 and a producing rate of \$620, but we contacted the working interest
owners and we have come to an agreement that \$5200 for the
drilling rate and a producing rate of \$520.

Q And in your professional opinion, Mr. Morton, are those — are those figures reasonable in the area?

A Yes, they are.

MR. CARSON: I would like to

CARSON: Yeah. This says 21 west half and ours says northwest/southwest. Α Okay. 23 Okay. I have a copy here of the applica-Q 24 tion for this hearing today and, Paragraph 2 of that applica-25

 tion the proposed well is located within one mile of the Northwest Lovington Pennsylvanian Pool. The applicant proposes to dedicate the west half southwest quarter of said section to this well.

Is it my understanding today that you wish to dedicate the north half of the southwest quarter?

A That's our proposed drilling unit, yes.

Q Okay. This, of course, will have to be readvertised to the hearing to be held exactly four weeks from today.

THE REPORTER: 14th of August.

MR. STOGNER: I've just been informed that that is August 14th, 1985, but we are prepared to go ahead and hear this case today and the testimony for the north half of the southwest quarter; however, an order will -- cannot be issued until after the correct advertisement is made.

MR. CARSON; I apologize, Mr. Examiner. I didn't realize, and I'm sure Mr. Morton didn't either, the change in signals there.

MR. STOGNER: Thank you, Mr.

Q Mr. Morton, on Exhibit B, the parties

which you are force pooling today, you mentioned Mr. Uphoff

has been located.

A Yes, he has.

Q Where, when, and what condition was he in and --

A Okay. We attempted to locate Mr. Uphoff in Illinois.

Mr. Opperman called, roughly, 27 people in Illinois and could not find him but Friday of last week a Mr. Chuck Herron (sic) in our Denver Office received a call from Mr. Rowan and said that he had located Mr. Uphoff and he did not say where, but he did say that he was attempting to get an oil and gas lease from him.

Q The addresses that you show for the other two parties, were they -- and you mentioned that they were the last addresses known.

A Uh-huh.

Q When did they seem to drop out of sight?

A Okay, well, let me start off with Alfred

-- well, let's start off with William C. Uphoff.

That was the address that the deed was returned to, the deed when it was conveyed into Mr. Uphoff and that's where we sent this -- the notice to.

As far as Mr. Letzenick, the deed was returned to the Monarch Investment Company in Roswell. We sent our letter there; we made calls; we tried to find this

Monarch Investment Company; could not.

Mr. Opperman talked to an attorney in
Roswell who knows a lot of people there, by the name of Sim
Christy, and he had never heard fo Monarch Investment Company, and so we just could not find anything on that.

And Clarice Van Eman, we found out that

And Clarice Van Eman, we found out that it's -- instead of Bellings, Washington, it was Bellinham, Washington, and we checked, we had someone to check the phone books in that particular city and to make calls, but we just could not locate this Clarice Van Eman also.

Q When did Clarice Van Eman -- what was the last date she'd ever been heard of, heard from?

A I don't have that before me.

MR. CARSON: None of these are recent dates, though, are they?

A No, this is dating back in the thirties and forties.

Q Okay.

Now then, on your proposed overhead charges, \$200 --

A Uh-huh.

Q -- is this an overhead rate that has been charged voluntarily by Amerada Hess to other parties in this area?

A Yes, we've charged more than this in the

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13 area. 1 Okay. Have -- has Amerada Hess accepted Q 2 these charges voluntarily when Amerada Hess has been leased 3 by other parties? Α Yes. 5 What were overhead charges about 0 6 time last year? 7 We entered into an agreement with Yates Α 8 concerning the Lovington No. 8 Well. I don't have that ex-9 act figure in front of me but it was roughly about the same. 10 How about two years ago? 0 11 Α I don't -- I don't have that figure. 12 Or three years ago? 13 Α I don't have that. 14 In your opinion this overhead charge of 15 \$5200 while drilling and \$520 is not excessive? 16 Α It is not excessive. 17 STOGNECT: MR. Are there any 18 other questions of this witness? 19 If not, he may be excused. 20 Mr. Carson? 21 MR. CARSON: I'd like to have 22

Mr. Lupe, please.

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ROBERT D. LUPE, 1 being called as a witness and being duly sworn upon 2 oath, testified as follows, to-wit: 3 DIRECT EXAMINATION 5 BY MR. CARSON: 6 Mr. Lupe, would you state your name once 7 again for the record? 8 Α Robert Lupe. 9 And, Mr. Lupe, by whom are you employed? Q 10 Α I'm employed by Amerada Hess. 11 0 In what capacity? 12 I am a geologist in the Midcontinent Α 13 Area. 14 Q You have not previously testified before 15 the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division, have you? 16 Α No, I haven't. 17 Would you tell the examiner a little bit Q 18 about your educational background? 19 Α I graduated with a BA from Pomono Yes. 20 College, Claremont, California. 21 Received a Master's degree from the 22 versity of Washington in Seattle. 23 In what --Q 24 Α In geology. 25

Q -- in geology?

And what kind of experience have you had in West Texas and New Mexico?

A I have been MidContinent Area, the area responsible for Texas and New Mexico since January of this year.

Q Are you acquainted with this AHC Andrus
No. 1-9 prospect of Amerada Hess'?

A Yes, I am.

Q I'm going to hand you what has been marked as Applicant's Exhibit D and D-l and ask if you're acquainted with those?

A Yes, I am.

Q And would you tell the examiner what those are?

A Exhibit D is titled "Final AFE Cost Estimate". That's the estimated cost for the drilling of the subject well.

Exhibit D-1 is the cost comparison. We exhibit that item in order to show the reasonableness and the accuracy of our experience in estimating well costs in the area.

Q And are those two exhibits accurate to the best of your knowledge and belief?

A Yes, they are.

The intent of this exhibit is to show --7 is to document, rather, the risk associated with the pros-8 pect. Q Was this exhibit prepared by you or under 10 your supervision or have you examined it and determined 11 accuracy? 12 Yes, I have. 13 Q Okay. 14 CARSON; I would like MR 15 move the introduction of Applicant's Exhibit F and I'll have 16 him explain this a little further. 17 MR. STOGNER: Exhibit F will be 18 admitted into evidence. 19 Lupe, do you have any -- do you know Mr. 20 what -- how many of these wells are dry holes? 21 I could count them up for you. Α They are 22 identified by traditional dry hole symbols --23 0 Okay. 24 Α -- on the map and of course all fo them 25

are unprofitable wells. 1 And how many --2 They're not producing. Α And how many -- you also have some wells Q that will pay out, is that correct? 5 Α Right. They are identified by the yellow 6 7 circle. Q Do you have in your -- do you have 8 opinion as to a risk factor that should be assigned to well based on your analysis of the wells which either 10 not -- will not pay out, will pay out, or were dry holes? 11 We're risking this at one in three. 12 analysis comes from our analysis of the geology and I'd be 13 happy to elaborate on this, if you'd like. 14 Okay, do, surely. 15 Q Production here is -- is very local. 16 reservoir is complex, unpredictable, stratigraphic trap, 17 18 rather than a structural trap, associated with algal mound 19 development in Strawn rocks. 20 MR. STOGNER: Let's get algal out of the way. How do you spell that? 21 22 Α A-L-G-A-L. 23 MR. STOGNER: Please continue. 24 Thank you. A main feature of the exhibit Ω 25 that I would like to point out is the fact that production

is unpredictable and as you see from the exhibit, there are 1 many dry holes not only ringing production but right in the middle of it in this Northeast Lovington Pennsylvanian Pool. So not only do we see a great deal of -of unpredictability and risk within that Northeast Lovington 5 Pool itself, but as we go -- as we try and stretch the limits of that pool to the northeast in the area of that 7 subject well, we even see greater risk. Based on your analysis of this area do Q 9 you have a penalty to recommend to the Commission? 10 Cost plus 200 percent. 11 Mr. Lupe, in your opinion will the grant-12 ing of this application for the forced pooling prevent 13 waste, protect correlative rights and otherwise protect the 14 rights of the parties? 15 Yes, I believe so. Α 16 MR. CARSON; I don't have any 17 further questions. 18 MR. STOGNER: I have no ques-19 tions of Mr. Lupe. 20 Are there any other questions 21 of this witness? 22 If not, he may be excused. 23 there anything further Ιs in 24 Case Number 8650 today? 25
