Gentlemen:

Your letter of April 8, 1971 requests approval to terminate the East Bisti unit agreement No. 14-08-0001-8551 San Juan County, New Mexico. The enclosed letter ballots are executed by owners representing in excess of 83 percent of the aggregate working interest participation percentage. You state under "Disposition" on page 3 of your application that "Unit Operator will plug and abandon all wells not being taken over by the former operator or partner or a third party accepting assignment of the well." Under attachment No. 6 you list the producing wells to be retained by the former operator or assignee after dissolving the unit.

We are unable to approve your application until you (1) have satisfactorily completed the abandonment of the unnecessary wells as unit operator and (2) advise us of the equipment which will be installed to measure individual lease production from the Federal and Indian producing leases following termination of the East Bisti unit agreement. Accordingly, the requested May 1, 1971, effective date appears inappropriate and your application will be in condition for approval when the above-described action has been completed.

Two additional watered-out Gallup oil wells will be converted to Ojo Alamo water supply wells to supplement the present water source.

Injection profiles will be run on additional water injection wells to determine the need for possible remedial work.



In accordance with Section 12 of the Unit Agreement for the Development and Operation of the East Bisti Unit, San Juan County, New Mexico, Skelly Oil Company respectfully submits for your approval a plan of development and operation of the subject Unit for 1968.

PAST OPERATION

The East Bisti Unit became effective October 1, 1963 with Skelly Oil Company as Unit Operator. Injection facilities were constructed and injection of water into 24 injection wells commenced during February, 1965.

During September, 1967, Well No. 79 was recompleted as a water supply well in the Ojo Alamo for approximately 1,650 barrels of water per day.

Cumulative water injection to December 1, 1967 was 14,454,019 barrels. The average daily injection rate during November, 1967 was 12,993 barrels.

Cumulative oil production to November 1, 1967 from the Unit area has been 6,305,387 barrels. The average daily producing rate during October was 471 barrels of oil.


DEVELOPMENT PLANS FOR 1968

Plans are to continue injection into the present water injection wells. No drilling is planned for additional oil recovery wells nor for the conversion of any wells to injection during 1968.

Based on the performance of Unit Well No. 79, the Ojo Alamo will be studied for possible additional water supply wells.

Injektivty profiles were run on 5 water injection wells during November, 1967. The results of these surveys indicate that further study of all injection wells will be required and some remedial work performed to insure flooding of the proper zones.
