Gentlemen:

This office has reviewed the unexecuted copy of unit agreement for the proposed North Park Deep Unit Area. Chaves County, New Mexico. This agreement meets the general requirements of the Commissioner of Public Lands and has this date granted you preliminary approval as to form and content.

Preliminary approval shall not be construed to mean final approval of this agreement in any way and will not extend any short term leases, until final approval and an effective date have geen given. Also, any well commenced prior to the effective date of this agreement which penetrates its objective horizon prior to said effective date shall not be construed as the initial test well.

When submitting your agreement for final approval please submit the following:

- 1. Application for formal approval by the Commissioner setting forth the tracts that have been committed and the tracts that have not been committed.
- All ratifications from the lessees of Record and Working Interest Owners. All signatures should be acknowledged by a notary and one set must contain original signatures.
- 3. Order of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division and the Designation from the Bureau of Land Management. Our approval will be conditioned upon subsequent favorable approval by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division and the Bureau of Land Management.
- 4. Article 3 of the unit agreement should be revised to reflect the correct unitized formations and intervals as described in Article 9.

5. On Exhibits "A" and "B". Tract No. 10, our records indicate that the lessee of record for State Lease No. E-8754 should be changed to Ernest A. Hanson. Our statutes require that we use the information as reflected on our records. We have no record that Hanson-McBride Petroleum Company is the record title owner for this lease.

Your filing fee in the amount of \$180.00 Dollars has been received.

Gentlemen:

In response to your letter dated October 6, 1986, after carefully examining the above proposed unit it has been determined that approval thereof will not be in the best interest of the State of New Mexico. Before the Land Commissioner can proceed to approve any unit agreement three legal tests must be met.

- A. Such agreement will tend to promote the conservation of oil or gas and the better utilization of reservoir energy;
- B. Under the operations proposed the State and each beneficiary of the lands involved will receive its fair share of the recoverable oil or gas in place under its lands in the area affected; and
- C. The agreement is in other respects for the best interest of the State.

Since Marathon cannot make a commitment to drill a second (2nd) exploratory well on State Lands, the Federal method of determining participation would leave the State contributing "Protection" acreage without compensation. Additionally, the following observations, made by our geologist, influenced our decision:

- A Truncated Lower Paleozoic wedge does exist in the area. Oil and gas shows are recorded along this wedge.
- 2. Marathon has not demonstrated the existence of a meritorious structure in this area.
- 3. Marathon has not demonstrated the Geologic need for a six section unit. In fact, their geologic evidence is inadequate.

- 4. Without Amoco's Participation the unit is gutted and no down-dip protective buffer exists. Amoco is free to drill in the event of a discovery, a definite advantage to the State.
- 5. The bulk of closure (\pm 200 Feet) is on Federal leases. Sections 16 and 28 do not appear to serve any useful purpose without the inclusion of Section 21. A three section Federal unit would appear to be more in line with Marathon's needs.

We have weighed the many factors which have significance in unit approval and it has been determined that your proposed unit does not meet the requirements necessary for approval.

For this reason, Sections 16 and 28 both in Township 11 South, Range 27 East, are hereby excluded from your proposed unit area.
