
I have not had an answer to my letter of Sept. 24th, requesting forms to be filled out, for the land owner to accept the above well "as is", for a water well.

New Shallow Water Well At Sedan

A great amount of interest is being shown in the shallow water irrigation well just completed at the Emmet J. Walker ranch one mile north of Sedan.

The 220 foot well was given a 72 hour test, Saturday thru Monday and averaged 500 gallons a minute. Mr. A. B. Hughes, of Sedan, who drilled the well predicted that the flow would gradually increase to 1,000 gallons.

The pump which is the latest screw-type is powered by a Ford six cylinder industrial type engine which runs on butane.

The ranch was homesteaded by Jack Scrogin of Clayton who sold it to Mr. Walker several years ago.
