

Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.*

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.*

An initial soil investigation was conducted in 1997, followed by the installation of nine (9) monitor wells in the years following. As of the 1st quarter 2015, all onsite monitor wells have exhibited BTEX and PAH concentrations less than the NMOCD and regulatory guidelines for a minimum of eight (8) consecutive quarters. Based on the analytical results, Plains requests groundwater and site closure. For additional details, please reference the 2014 Annual Monitoring Report and Site Closure Request dated March 2015.
