RE: Remediation Closure Report for the Mesa #002H Tank Battery Release (1RP-5703), Lea County, New Mexico

### To whom it concerns:

On behalf of BTA Oil Producers, LLC (BTA), C&M Services, LLC. (C&M) has prepared this Liner Inspection/Closure Report that describes the liner inspection related to the release of liquids related to oil and gas production activities at the Mesa #002H Tank Battery site. The release site is in Unit D, Section 11, Township 26S, Range 32E, Lea County, New Mexico, on Federal land.

### Release History

On August 29, 2019, a release was discovered at the Mesa #002H Tank Battery site due to communications being interrupted on the PLC, so no high tank alarm was sent out until communications were restored. Initial response activities were conducted by BTA and included source elimination and site security; containment; and site stabilization activities, which recovered approximately 15 barrels of fluid. Map 1 illustrates the vicinity and site location. The initial C-141 form is included in Appendix A.

The Mesa #002H Tank Battery is located approximately 27 miles southwest of Jal, New Mexico on federally owned land at an elevation of approximately 3,246 feet above mean sea level (amsl).

There are no known water sources within ½-mile of the location, according to the New Mexico Office of the State Engineer (NMOSE) online water well database. Depth to groundwater in the area is estimated to be greater than 100 feet below grade surface (bgs). The nearest significant watercourse is the Pecos River, located approximately 19.5 miles to the southwest. Map 2



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illustrates the site with 100, 200, and 300-foot radii to indicate that it does not lie within a sensitive area as described in 19.15.29.12.C(4) NMAC.

### Liner Inspection and Documentation

On Oct.15, 2019 a full visual inspection of the liner was conducted by C&M personnel. The liner was found to be completely intact. Please see attached Photo log (Appendix C).

### Conclusion

Based on the recovery of all the released liquids and the integrity of the liner being intact, BTA requests closure of this spill. The final C-141 is enclosed in Appendix A. If you have any questions or comments concerning this report, please call Jacqui Harris at 575-496-0780.



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

Cause of Release

Communications were interrupted on the PLC, so no high tank alarm was sent out until communications were restored. At that time, the water tank was about to overflow. The operator saw the water tank start to overflow and was able to start a transfer pump to stop the overflow. No more than 15 BBL of produced water overflowed into the lined containment of the tank battery. The produced water was mixed with rainwater that was already in containment due to rain over the previous 24 hours. All water was completely recovered with a vacuum truck and loaded for proper disposal.
