The Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has received your request, dated October 5, 1994, for authorization to discharge approximately 33,665 gallons of waste water from the hydrostatic testing of a six (6) mile section of new pipeline (12" line) located near Los Alamos, New Mexico.

Based on the information provided in your request, the hydrostatic test water discharge is hereby approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The test water will be discharged into a manhole of the United States Department of Energy's Los Alamos National Laboratory sanitary sewer system along the west side of Bikini Road south from West Jemez Road, Los Alamos County, New Mexico.
- 2. The pipe must be new and never previously used for oil and/or gas transmission.
- 3. The test water will be potable water obtained from a fire hydrant located along East Jemez Road.

Pursuant to WQCC Regulation 3-106.B, this approval will allow you to discharge without an approved discharge plan for a period not to exceed 120 days. If the site is to be used for more than one test discharge, formal reapplication must be made. If the discharge exceeds 120 days, a formal discharge plan must be submitted for review.
