RE: Application for Hydrostatic Test Water Discharge Lea County, New Mexico

Dear Mr. McConnell:

The Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has received your request, dated March 1, 1993, requesting authorization to discharge the hydrostatic test water from the test of your 6-5/8" pipeline from your Jal #4 plant that goes south into Texas. Your proposal is to dispose of this test water into Christie Gas Corporations' Shell State #13 disposal well (Class II). The application was submitted pursuant to Water Quality Control Commission (WQCC) Regulation 3-106.B. and is hereby denied pursuant to that regulation, and the proposed disposal method does not comply with Federal Underground Injection Control (UIC) Regulations.

Federal Regulations (40 CFR 146.5) authorize the injection of exploration and production waste, and certain gas plant waste, into a Class II injection well. Waste water generated from the hydrostatic testing of mainline gas transmission systems are not in these categories. Furthermore this waste is not exempt from RCRA Subtitle C. This exemption is reserved for wastes from the exploration, development, and production of crude oil, natural gas, and geothermal energy. The test water discharge is subject to hazardous waste determination. This determination can be made by sampling and analyzing the test water discharge for toxic constituents, ignitability, corrositivity, and reactivity.

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Once you have determined if the waste water exhibits hazardous characteristics or not, you will be able to devise a method of disposal. The OCD Environmental Bureau staff is available to assist in helping advise you on this matter.
