Please note that TNMPL site TNM 96-21 is complete and you have sent approval letter.

TNM 96-20 is still active. TNMPL is planning on remediating the landfarmed soil to guideline levels and continue to monitor the ground water monitor well.

Please note the approval you sent on January 29, 1997 is considered by TNMPL to be an approval of their original intent. TNMPL (Tony Savoie) called and informed me that when they reach their remediation level goals they will then fill in all of the excavated areas and address the closing of the MW in a final closure report to be sent to you for approval.

Hope this clears up the issue.


The New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has completed a review of Texas-New Mexico Pipe Line Company's (TNMPLC) November 22, 1996 report containing the results of remedial actions associated with a crude oil spill at the TNM-96-21 site located in Unit D, Sec. 18, T25S, R36E, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

The remedial actions at the TNM-96-21 site, as contained in the above referenced document, are approved.
