Comments:

Met with GPM rep's Mel Driver & Ronnie Gillcrest. Leak occured in a playa lake bed (buffalo wallow). This playa was dry at the time of the leak. Approxmately 200 bbl's of Crude oil(130) & Water (75) recovered by vacumm truck. Observed free oil still present in Buffalo Wallow. Recommend to GPM to determine if notification required to EPA.

Instructed GPM to continue picking up free oil & water. Granted GPM permission under emergency responce conditions to excavate and haul contaminated soil to GPM Linam Ranch Plant. GPM will start excavation after free liquid is picked up today or tomorrow.

GPM will notify NMOCD to witness bottom hole samples. Once NMOCD approves closure, GPM to fill with clean soil that has similer soil characteristics.

GPM will submit information with subsequent report within 15 days.
