### Comments:

Dear Roger,

Jerry Sexton has requested that I contact you concerning this pit closure at the above mentioned location. Jerry would like for me to coordinate this closure thru your office.

The original pit closure request was submitted to the Hobbs District and received on April 21, 1995. On May 1, 1995 I visited the site and took pictures. It was discovered at that time that the pit closure had already begun. The dikes on the south side of the pit had been broken and the pit liquids were allowed to flow out onto the ground.

At this time I advised Jerry Sexton that it appears that PPM's remedial action of allowing the pit liquids to be discharged to the ground was ambiguous and not consistent with their pit closure submittal which stated "No Free liquids are in the pit". Also the pit closure plan did not address some of the key environmental assessment criteria, such as vertical extent of the contamination and final remediation levels.

Jerry had informed me that PPM had indicated to District personnel that they felt they were not in a good economic position to close the pit per NMOCD guidelines and the fact that the guidelines were not rules, made it unclear to the District as to what legal authority the NMOCD had on determining when, how or what criteria should be used to close pits.

In early May of 1995 we had a meeting with yourself, Bill Olson, and Bill LeMay in Hobbs concerning procedures to be used at the District level. At that time we all had discussed an "Interim Policy" concerning pit closures and Bill Olson had designed the new "Approval Conditions" to streamline the approval process.

As you know the "Interim Policy" never became reality and this particular pit closure submittal was never approved and no action taken on the District level.

On Feb. 7, 1996 of this year Jerry Sexton received a letter from Gary Cothran of PPM (attached) requesting permission to remove the contaminated soils from this lease and move it to their yard north of crossroads and use it as road repair materials.

Jerry requested I check into this matter and if I agree he would approve. I went to crossroads and the pit site and took pictures (enclosed).

After discussing the issue with Mr. Cothran, he indicated to me that PPM has plans on selling this SWD-288 (location of pit) to Penroc Corp.

According to Mr. Cothran, Penroc has requested the visually contaminated soils be removed from the site in order to complete the deal. PPM has no other plans concerning the pit closure other than to remove the contaminated soils from the surface and haul to their Crossroads yard. If anything else is required then PPM feels that they will just P&A the SWD and leave the site.

Mr. Cothran indicated if PPM is allowed to haul the material off-site as proposed then PPM feels that their responsibility of any further pit closure plans will be transferred to Penroc upon and pending the sell conditions.

After discussing with Jerry, he didn't think Penroc will be willing to accept this responsibility.

Jerry Sexton informed me that I should contact you and request that the NMOCD Environmental Bureau handle this pit closure.

Therefore, we have enclosed a complete copy of the file associated with this location and respectively request your Environmental Bureau's assistance in this matter.

Please let us know if we can assist you or your staff in any way concerning this matter.

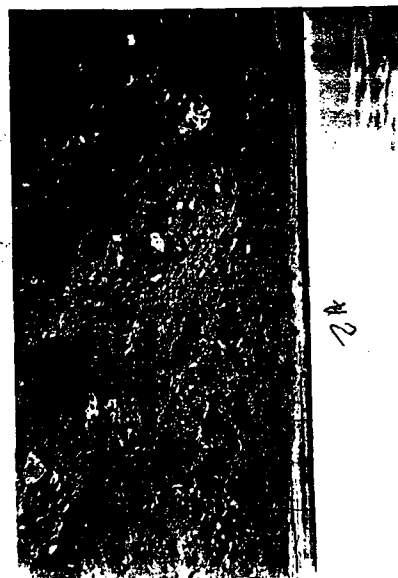

Dear Mr. Cothran,

The New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (NMOCD) is in receipt of the two pit closure requests that you have submitted on September 7, 1994 and April 17, 1995 and which are located approximately in (sec 5-Ts 9s-R36e) and (sec 34-Ts 13s-R32e) respectively.

Please be aware that the NMOCD Environmental Bureau is in the process of formulating a new interim policy on pit closures. Hopefully, this policy will allow the operators and the NMOCD districts more flexibility and streamline the "Pit Closure" approval process.

However, there will be certain requirements of an operator if he chooses to close the pit with contaminants remaining in the ground. Under this scenario the operator will be required to determine the vertical extent of the contamination and demonstrate that the remaining contaminants have not, or will not, impact ground water in the foreseeable future, and/or adversely affect public health and the environment.

Please note, as soon as we receive this new interim policy this office will forward you a copy. We anticipate it will be two to three weeks before it is issued.
