Dear Mr. Dolan:

The New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has reviewed the Yates Petroleum Corporation's (Yates) AMENDED STAGE 1 ABATEMENT PLAN PROPOSAL AND WORK PLAN - INEX PIT SITE (AP-24) submitted on February 15, 2005, in response to OCD's letter of October 6, 2004. OCD required Yates to submit this workplan because it had not completely defined the extent of the ground water contamination at the Inex pit site. Yates requested and received a 45 day extension to the required due date of December 31, 2004.

As discussed below in detail, OCD has noted several problems with this proposed workplan that must be addressed before the workplan can be approved.

1) In Section V (Vertical and Horizontal Extent of Contamination) Yates states "*There is no apparent readily discernable pattern of chloride distribution in the boreholes....*" In Section VI (Groundwater), Yates states "*The source of the highly elevated chlorides in monitor well MW-3 is unknown.*" These two statements indicate a major problem with the proposed Stage 1 workplan - Yates has not adequately characterized the site conditions at the Inex pit site using all the data that it has collected. Cross sections clearly demonstrate that chlorides released from the Inex pit have contaminated both soil and ground water beneath the pit. Yates must revise its

Stage 1 workplan by providing an interpretation of the previously collected data supported by an appropriate number of isoconcentration maps and cross sections that depict the contamination that has been released from the former pit. Only after it interprets the existing data can Yates propose a meaningful workplan to complete its investigation.

The workplan must be revised to propose a sufficient number of additional soil borings beneath and adjacent to the former pit that will enable Yates to completely characterize the release from the Inex pit. The workplan must also propose a sufficient number of additional downgradient monitor wells that will enable Yates to characterize the ground water contamination beneath and downgradient from its pit and for use in a ground water monitoring program. The workplan must also propose additional contingent soil borings and monitor wells if the next phase of the Stage 1 investigation fails to completely delineate the release. The workplan must also specify that Yates will analyze for all of the constituents specified by OCD in its February 1, 2002 conditional approval letter. OCD notes that Yates has not analyzed samples for the New Mexico Water Quality Control Commission (WQCC) metals as required.

2) In its proposed Action Plan, Yates states that "Based on evaluation of the existing information, the conditions at this site appear to be related to an outside source of groundwater contamination rather than contamination the pit." After reviewing all of the information in the Inex pit site file, OCD strongly disagrees with Yates' assertion that the contamination detected at the site was not released from the former unlined and grossly contaminated pit during a lengthy period of oil and gas production operations. Yates has not provided any compelling arguments to support its "outside source" interpretation in its proposal nor in any of its previous submittals. Review of the local geology and hydrogeology at the Inex pit site, using maps and cross sections constructed using the data submitted by Yates, clearly demonstrates that a release from the Inex pit has contaminated ground water with chlorides at concentrations that exceed the WQCC ground water protection standards (20.6.2.3103 NMAC) and that residual chlorides and hydrocarbons presently contaminate the vadose zone beneath the pit.

3) Yates may voluntarily pursue an alternate source demonstration for the known contamination, but regardless of what Yates chooses to do about a possible alternate source demonstration, it must submit a revised Stage 1 workplan to OCD in which it proposes additional investigation that will enable it to completely characterize the release at the Inex pit site.

4) The workplan must also address the requirement for Yates to provide the data necessary to select and design an effective abatement option, which it must propose in a separate Stage 2 Abatement Plan to be submitted after the Stage 1 investigation has been concluded. Of course, Yates may propose appropriate remedial actions to be taken concurrently with the Stage 1 investigation.

5) In its proposed Action Plan, Yates proposes to plug monitor well MW-4. This pit well is the single most useful data point that Yates has at this site and the proposal to abandon this well appears to be completely without merit. OCD will not approve Yates' proposal to plug and abandon monitor well MW-4.

OCD requires Yates to submit a revised Stage 1 Abatement Plan for its Inex pit site that addresses the above items in accordance with OCD's 1993 remediation guidelines by August 19, 2005, with a copy provided to OCD's Artesia District Office.

At the request of Yates Petroleum Corporation (Yates), Harding ESE is requesting an extension of time for the submittal of the Stage I Investigation Reports for the four above-referenced sites. Yates is requesting a 120-day extension of the due date for the submittal of the four Stage I Investigation Reports from April 1, 2002 to August 1, 2002. Yates has budgeted the Stage I work for initiation during the second quarter of calendar year 2002. Scheduling the work within this time frame allows Yates to more effectively monitor their non-recurring environmental expenses during this period of depressed oil and natural gas prices.

In 1997, Yates purchased production facilities, including the above referenced sites, from H&S Oil Company (H&S). H&S was a small, privately operated oil and gas producer that did not maintain an effective environmental management or compliance program. Since purchasing the facilities, Yates has made a considerable investment of both time and financial resources which has resulted in significant improvements to the environmental conditions of the Sites. The primary result of the improvements made to-date by Yates is the removal of the hydrocarbon source areas by properly closing the former unlined waste disposal pits, as presented in the Stage I Abatement Plan Proposals for each of the Stage I Abatement Plan Proposals will be



The Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has received your October 10, 2000 letter commenting on Yates Petroleum Corporation's (Yates) proposed Stage 1 abatement plans for investigation of the extent of contamination related to former unlined pits at Yates' Williams Pit Site located in Unit C, Section 25, Township 18 South, Range 26 East, Eddy County, New Mexico; the Lattion Pit Site located in Unit K, Section 23, Township 18 South, Range 26 East, Eddy County, New Mexico; the Inex Pit Site located in Unit F, Section 26, Township 18 South, Range 26 East, Eddy County and; the Scripp Pit Site located in Unit L, Section 25, Township 18 South, Range 26 East, Eddy County, New Mexico.

Pursuant to OCD Rule 19, the OCD required abatement plans because ground water at each site was found to be contaminated in excess of state standards during prior soil remediation and investigation activities. A review of the OCD's records shows that the water wells that you are concerned about are upgradient of the sites being investigated by Yates and therefore any problems with these wells would not be related to the contamination at the above-referenced sites. However, the OCD welcomes any comments you may have on these sites. Due to your interest in the investigations, you will receive copies of all future OCD correspondence concerning the abatement plan.

The abatement plan is broken into 2 stages, a Stage 1 Abatement Plan Proposal and a Stage 2 Abatement Plan Proposal. The purpose of the Stage 1 Abatement Plan Proposal is for the responsible person to determine the magnitude and extent of contamination that is related to their operations. The rules require that the responsible person provide public notice of the plan and allows a 30 day period

for receipt of public comments. Based upon a technical review of the proposal and consideration of the public comments, the OCD resolves deficiencies in the proposal with the responsible person and issues administrative approval of the Stage 1 Abatement Plan. The responsible person then conducts the investigations at the site and provides a Stage 1 Investigation Report to the OCD for approval.

Once the extent of contamination has been determined, the responsible person is required to submit a Stage 2 Abatement Plan Proposal which contains a proposed plan to remediate the site to state standards. The rule also requires that the responsible person provide public notice of the plan and allows a 30 day period for receipt of public comments and public requests for a hearing on the merits of the plan. A request for a public hearing must be in writing and must include the reasons why a hearing should be held. Based upon a technical review of the proposal and consideration of the public comments, the OCD attempts to resolve deficiencies in the proposal with the responsible person and then determines whether the Stage 2 Abatement Plan is administratively approvable or denied. If the plan is administratively denied, the applicant will be notified and it will be its responsibility to request a hearing appealing the denial. If the Stage 2 Abatement Plan is determined to be administratively approvable, the OCD will notify the applicant and all intervenors of the conditions under which the plan would be approved. Intervenors will be allowed fifteen (15) days from receipt of the determination to notify the OCD whether they still wish to proceed to hearing.





The New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has reviewed Yates Petroleum Corporation's (Yates) December 15, 2000 "PIT CLOSURE FOR INEX PIT SITE" and accompanying December 15, 2000 "PIT REMEDIATION AND CLOSURE REPORT", November 2000 "PRELIMINARY SITE INVESTIGATION REPORT, INEZ PIT SITE, EDDY COUNTY, NEW MEXICO" and February 28, 2000 "FINAL CLOSURE OF UNLINED SURFACE IMPOUNDMENTS – EDDY COUNTY, NEW MEXICO". These documents contain information on the closure and investigation of the extent of contamination at Yates' Inex Pit Site located in the SE/4 of the NW/4 of Section 26, Township 18 South, Range 26 East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico. The documents also request closure of the site remediation actions.

A review of the information provided shows that ground water underlying the pit is contaminated with benzene and chloride in excess of the New Mexico Water Quality Control Commission (WQCC) standards. Therefore, the OCD cannot issue final closure approval for the site. Pursuant to 19 NMAC 15.A.19.C.1, the OCD requires an abatement plan for the Inex Pit Site to abate ground water pollution. To initiate the abatement plan process, the OCD requires that Yates submit to the OCD by May 7, 2001 a Stage 1 abatement plan investigation proposal pursuant to OCD Rule 19.E.1. and OCD Rule 19.E.3. Yates Petroleum Corporation requests closure of the Inex Unlined Surface Impoundment located in Eddy County New Mexico with no further action required. A brief explanation of the history of our actions at this site follows, and is supplemented with reports from the contractors hired to close the pit. These actions followed OCD guidelines, and included scientific evidence obtained through analytical soil and water testing samples. The narrative explains our risk based analysis and request for closure. These results are contained in the "Preliminary Site Investigation Report" produced by Environmental Technology Group, Inc. (ETGI) and field activity notes and analytical results prepared by Bioremediation Contractors & Consultants, Inc. (BCC).

This Inex Unlined Surface Impoundment site is located in the SE ¹/₄ of the NW ¹/₄ of Section 26, Township 18 S, Range 26 East in Eddy County, New Mexico approximately 9 miles South of Artesia.

In 1997, Yates Petroleum Corporation purchased the H & S Production facilities. These facilities included unlined surface impoundments. As part of the purchase we had an Environmental Assessment done by Harding Lawson Associates (HLA) on this pit. HLA recommended we proceed with closure of this pit. In 1998 we received a bid from BCC to remove liquids, excavate and remediate the contaminated soil via an onsite land farm and to conduct analytical sampling until the pit site was clean enough to pursue closure activities.

Once BCC thought the pit was remediated to proper levels, they sent a closure request dated February 28, 2000 to Donna Williams at the OCD office in Hobbs. When I met with Donna in August 2000, she informed me that the closure report submitted by BCC (see enclosure) was inadequate for three reasons:

- The soil and water were not sampled for Chlorides
- There was inadequate soil sampling done
- There was no site map or narrative explanation of activities enclosed

In addition to this, BCC inadvertently sent the closure request to the OCD office in Hobbs when in fact the Artesia office had jurisdiction. Once we brought these situations to the attention of Mike Stubblefield, and discussed the deficiencies of the closure request, we contracted ETGI to conduct further analysis of this pit and assist us in our closure.

A complete closure report produced by ETGI is enclosed. Per that report, we drilled bore holes to ground water and sampled for Chlorides, TPH and BTEX, as well as took analytical samples and PID samples on the way down. We completed a site map with sample locations and narrative of all activities.

The results of the soil and water sampling, and an analysis of ground water subsurface flow along with a risk based analysis of the complete situation, lead us to the conclusion that the risk is acceptable with no further action required, and we should proceed with this closure request.

Please review the enclosed materials, and if acceptable grant us our closure request. If you have any questions on this request please do not hesitate to contact me at (505) 748-4223. We would like an approval for this pit closure request by January 26th, 2001.
