Hello Amy and Josie,

I dont have the C-141 for any other of the releases except for the one that occurred on 1/10/2019.

Aside from OCD's expectations of remediation you would also need to pursue advisement from the BLM on the circumstances of this location. I see that it is stated that 3 drilling related releases have occurred at this location. I am unaware of the volume of the third one you are mentioning. If these were submitted to the BLM they are not referable for some reason in our system. So through my own research using OCD's website I found the C-141s for two of the three releases that have 2RP-5204 and 2RP-5272 assigned to them. However, we still need Chevron to please send over to the BLM the C-141's for the other releases aside from the one that occurred on 1/10/2019.

As for advisement from the BLM, if Chevron is going to ask for an extension till December this year in order to perform remediation at this location, then the BLM would like to see statements in writing that all of the standing fluids were recovered and also see what the volumes were that were unrecoverable and where location wise were the impacts of the unrecoverable volumes (i.e. include a KMZ or some shape file indicating where contaminates hit surface).

Mr. Hamlet and Ms. Venegas,

We have had three spills on the same pad. Two of those are listed above and the other has not been assigned an RP number yet that I can find. I have re-sent the original C-141 to you both in a previous e-mail.

We would like to requested an extension on submitting a workplan until December 31, 2019. The current projected date for drilling to move from this location is the end of April 2019. The completions crew will be rigging up in May and is projected to be on site through September due to the size of the pad, therefore, our third party contractor will not be able to access the location until after this date. If they try to get on site between drilling and completions, the bore sampling could compromise the compaction of the pad. We would like to ask for an extension until December 31, 2019. With the extended time, we will be able to access the location, collect samples and submit a work plan. We should also be able to have the site remediated by the end of the year, as well. Please let me know if this is acceptable. Thank you for your consideration.
