Gentlemen:

In reference to your letter of November 12th concerning the one-well bond for R. P. Lynn covering the location in the SE/4 NE/4 Sec. 14-3S-30E, Roosevelt County, our records show that as of August 8, 1954, this well had not been plugged, or if so, it had not been plugged according to the Oil Commission Rules and Regulations. After we had contacted Mr. Lynn about this matter he furnished us with an affidavit stating that this location was now the responsibility of the First National Bank of Brownfield, Texas. On September 23 the First National Bank wrote to us, stating that they intended to plug this well in accordance with New Mexico rules and would submit the proper forms. As of this date, we have not received these forms on this well, and no further inspection has been made.

If this well has been properly plugged and abandoned, we shall appreciate it if you can perhaps help us in securing the proper forms and necessary information to clear up this matter. As soon as we have received these and another inspection has been made of this location to see that all Commission requirements have been met, then the forms can be approved.
