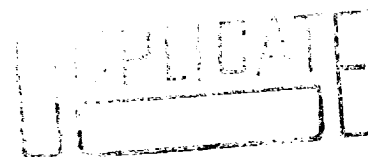

We will allow the cement to set 72 hours before moving in with cable tools. After drilling the plug and making the water shut-off test, the results of same will be forwarded.
