This well is pumping a considerable amount of mud; and since it is pumping less oil than when it was completed we believe there is a good possibility that the upper pay zone was not properly acidized.

We propose to clean out the hole; Set bridging plug (pea gravel) from 4678 back to 4660; then cement from 4660 back to 4680; then put in a rock bridge from 4760 back to 4765; then cement from 4765 to 4725; then treat the upper zone with 1000 gallons from 4640 to 4725 and test.
