FULL DETAILS OF PROPOSED PLAN OF WORK
(FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS)

We propose a change in the casing program, setting the 13 3/8" casing at 2795' rather than 2800. Order #2-111-A states that in the potash area the salt protection string shall be set at least 100', and not more than 600', below the base of the salt. We propose to set the salt protection string in subject well between 50' and 60' below the base of the salt in order to obtain a good casing seat. We have checked with the WMS and the following potash companies who have interests in the area and have received their approval. The potash companies concerned are: The U.S. Potash Company, International Mineral & Chemical Corp. and National Farmers Union Service Corporation.
