DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

6-5/8" 20# 10-thd. New Seamless Casing was set in this well at 3828' and Cemented by the Halliburton Method with 100 sacks.

Casing and fitting were tested with 1200# pump pressure and allowed to stand undisturbed for thirty minutes. No drop in pressure resulted. The cement was then drilled out of the casing and the same test of 1200# pressure again applied and allowed to stand undisturbed for thirty minutes. No drop in pressure resulted. The drilling was then resumed.

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REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONER OF LAND MANAGEMENT

The following report was prepared by the Bureau of Land Management, Department of the Interior, for the use of the President and the Senate in connection with the consideration of the proposed legislation for the establishment of a new Bureau of Land Management.

It is respectfully recommended that the following be adopted:

7. To conduct the management and protection of the public lands of the United States.

8. To conduct the administration and supervision of the public lands of the United States.

9. To conduct the education and information of the public regarding the public lands of the United States.

10. To conduct the research and investigation of the public lands of the United States.

11. To conduct the conservation and protection of the public lands of the United States.

12. To conduct the reclamation and improvement of the public lands of the United States.

13. To conduct the development and utilization of the public lands of the United States.
