PHILOSOPHY 300: THE PHENOMENON OF CONSCIOUSNESS

LECTURE 1: THE PROBLEM OF CONSCIOUSNESS
What is the nature of consciousness? How is it related to the physical world? These are the central questions of the course.

In this lecture, we will explore the historical roots of the problem of consciousness, from the ancient Greeks to the modern era. We will also discuss the various philosophical approaches to the problem, including dualism, materialism, and functionalism.

By the end of the course, you should be able to identify the major philosophical positions on consciousness and evaluate their strengths and weaknesses.

Readings: Descartes, *Meditations on First Philosophy*; Locke, *An Essay Concerning Human Understanding*; Berkeley, *Principles of Human Knowledge*.

Next week, we will turn to the philosophy of mind and the relationship between the mind and the brain.

Assignment: Write a paper on the philosophy of mind, focusing on the relationship between the mind and the brain.
