DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

5250' Drilled Out Depth. Ran 160 qts. Nitroglycerin from 5200' to 5250' and put 50' pea gravel on top. Charge went off at 5:00PM, 4-13-48. Went in hole with 7-3/4" bit and cleaned and washed out hole to 5250'. Ran Guiberson Packer and 170 jts. of 2-7/8" OD Hydril Tubing w/1-4' perf. sub on bottom bull plugged, 1-2' handling sub and 1-8' & 1-4' subs on top. Set packer at 5137' with bottom of tubing at 5232'. Started swabbing and in 4 hrs. to 7:00AM, 4-16-48, swabbed 35.19 bbls. load oil. In 26 1/2 hrs. to 9:30AM, 4-17-48, swabbed 12.42 bbls. load oil. Stopped swabbing, unseated packer, displaced fluid in hole with 320 bbls. water and pulled tubing.

DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE
