#### FULL DETAILS OF PROPOSED PLAN OF WORK FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSION

It is proposed to install Acme intermittent gas lift equipment at State "E" No. 3, so that this well's allowable can be produced without pumping. The gas to be used at this well is to be obtained from the casing at State "E" No. 2. The gas from the casing at State "E" No. 2, is sour gas which is produced from perforations in the casing at 3554' to 3704'. (This interval being opposite the gas cap in the First Bone Oil producing horizon.) The total amount of gas to be taken from State "E" No. 2, will not exceed the volume obtained by multiplying the well's allowable by 4000. (The maximum ratio permitted for Monument Field).
