Gentlemen:

By this letter of application, Gulf Oil Corporation wishes to state the following:

- (a) That Gulf Oil Corporation's F. W. Kutter "C" No. 1, located 1980' FNL and 660' FEL of Section 18-195-37E, was completed April 18, 1937, at a total depth of 4026'. The attached Exhibit "A" shows the location of this well on the Gulf Oil Corporation's F. W. Kutter "C" Lease together with the location of all offset wells.
- (b) That subject well has 7" casing set at 3874 and cemented with 400 sacks of cement. The well is an oil well producing from the open hole interval from 3874-4026 in the Monument Pool.
- (c) That the applicant proposed to dually complete the well in the following manner:
 - (1) Perforate the 7" casing within the approximate interval of 3520-3640' in the Eumont Gas Pool.
 - (2) Set production type packer below these perforations at approximately 3825' to separate the two pay zones.
 - (3) Produce the Monument Pool Oil through the tubing and the Eumont Pool Gas through the tubing-casing annulus.
- (d) That the granting of this application for permission to produce the well as a dual completion with gas from the Eumont and oil from the Monument is in the interest of conservation and the protection of correlative rights.
- (e) That the applicant will comply with all rules and regulations of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission to maintain separation of production from the two pay zones.
- (f) That the manner and method of the proposed dual completion is mechanically feasible and practical.
