Gulf Oil Corporation hereby makes application for approval of a non-standard gas production unit comprising the SE/4 Section 20, T-19-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico, and in support thereof states the following facts:

- (1) The working interests ownership of the three tracts comprising the proposed 160-acre non-standard gas production unit is as follows:
 - (a) W/2 SE/4 Section 20, T-19-S, R-37-E (80 acres)- Gulf Oil Corporation - F. W. Kutter Lease.
 - (b) SE/4 SE/4 Section 20, T-19-S, R-37-E (40 acres)- Shell Oil Company - State "N" Lease.
 - (c) SE/4 SE/4 Section 20, T-19-S, R-37-E (40 acres)- Mr. J. B. Headley et al - Klingsmith Lease.
- (2) In order to enable the production of gas-well gas for the Eumant Formation underlying the proposed non-standard gas unit, Gulf Oil Corporation is planning to drill and complete within the vertical limits of the Eumant Gas Pool the F. W. Kutter #3 at a location which will be 1650 feet from the East line and either 990 or 1650 feet from the South line of Section 20, T-19-S, R-37-E.
- (3) Subject to the authorization of the Oil Conservation Commission for the operation of the SE/4 Section 20, T-19-S, R-37-E, as a non-standard 160-acre Eumant Pool gas production unit and the ascribing of the 160-acre unit to Gulf's proposed F. W. Kutter #3, Gulf, Shell, and J. B. Headley et al have agreed to enter
