COMMISSION ON THE ORGANIZATION OF THE COURTS

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION

CHAPTER I

The Commission was organized on July 1, 1934, by the Executive Order of the President of the United States. Its purpose was to study the organization of the Federal courts and to report its findings and recommendations to the President.

The Commission has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from judges, lawyers, and laymen. It has also conducted extensive research into the history and present condition of the Federal courts.

The Commission believes that the present organization of the Federal courts is inefficient and that certain reforms are necessary to bring about a more economical and expeditious administration of justice.

The Commission's recommendations are set forth in this report. They are based on the principles of economy, efficiency, and the best interests of the public.

The Commission believes that the following reforms are essential: (1) the elimination of overlapping jurisdictions; (2) the consolidation of the Federal courts; (3) the reorganization of the Federal judges; and (4) the improvement of the methods of selecting Federal judges.

The Commission believes that these reforms will result in a more economical and expeditious administration of justice, and will thereby benefit the public.

The Commission believes that the reforms recommended in this report are necessary and feasible. It urges the President to take prompt action upon these recommendations.
