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## MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

On 10/10/00, the Director of the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) received a letter from the Department of Justice (DOJ) regarding the proposed acquisition of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). The letter stated that the DOJ was considering the acquisition of the FBI as part of a reorganization of the Department of Justice. The DOJ was seeking comments from the OIG on the proposed acquisition.

The proposed acquisition of the FBI by the DHS is a significant event that will have a major impact on the federal law enforcement system. The OIG is responsible for providing the Director with information on the proposed acquisition and its potential impact on the federal law enforcement system.

The OIG has conducted a preliminary review of the proposed acquisition and has identified several areas of concern. The first area of concern is the potential impact of the proposed acquisition on the federal law enforcement system. The OIG is concerned that the proposed acquisition will result in a loss of the FBI's independence and its ability to act as a check and balance on the executive branch.
